

Florida's August Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.8 percent in August 2025, up 0.1 percentage point from the July 2025 rate, and up 0.4 percentage point from a year ago. There were 424,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,196,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3 percent in August.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,048,400 in August 2025, a decrease of 4,100 jobs (less than -0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 98,200 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 0.9 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Nine of ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in August.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+38,000 jobs, +2.5 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+23,400 jobs, +1.2 percent); total government (+12,800 jobs, +1.1 percent); leisure and hospitality (+9,100 jobs, +0.7 percent); other services (+6,900 jobs, +1.8 percent); financial activities (+2,800 jobs, +0.4 percent); construction (+2,200 jobs, +0.3 percent); manufacturing (+1,800 jobs, +0.4 percent); and Information (+1,700 jobs, +1.1 percent).
- Professional and business services (-300 jobs, less than -0.1 percent) lost jobs from a year ago.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2025, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.9 percent), followed by Monroe County (3.1 percent), and Wakulla County (3.9 percent).
- Sumter County had the highest unemployment rate (7.6 percent) in Florida in August 2025, followed by Taylor County (7.5 percent), and Citrus County (6.6 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2025, 20 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+18,000 jobs, +1.2 percent), followed by the Tampa MD (+17,300 jobs, +1.6 percent), and the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+16,100 jobs, +1.2 percent).
- Five metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in August 2025. The areas losing jobs were the St. Petersburg -Clearwater-Largo MD (-3,900 jobs, -0.8 percent), the Panama City-Panama City Beach MSA (-1,400 jobs, -1.5 percent), Crestview-Fort Walton Beach-Destin MSA (-1,100 jobs, -0.8 percent), the Naples-Marco Island MSA (-200 jobs, -0.1 percent), and the Homosassa Springs MSA (-200 jobs, -0.6 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
