MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

CAREERSOURCE BROWARD

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA

THIS IS AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE to Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) entered into on the 21st day of July, 2020 by and between CareerSource Broward ("CSBD") as the administrative entity for the CSBD Council of Elected Officials ("Council") and for the Broward Workforce Development Board, Inc. ("BWDB") and The School Board of Broward County, Florida ("SBBC") a body politic and a one stop partner under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, P.L. 113-128 ("WIOA"). CSBD and SBBC are collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as the "Party."

RECITALS

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, P.L. 113-128 as codified in 20 C.F.R. Part 678 ("WIOA") requires that the CSBD Council and the BWDB, enter into an MOU with each one-stop partner identified in the legislation.

CSBD serves as the administrative entity for both the BWDB and the Council in Workforce Development Area 22, and CSBD is authorized to enter this MOU on behalf of the BWDB and the Council.

SBBC is a one-stop partner identified in WIOA Sec. 121(b)(1) as the grantee entity and provider of Adult Education and Literacy Act activities and postsecondary Career and Technical Education programs authorized under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (20 U.S.C. 2301 et seq.).

WIOA requires the BWDB to competitively select a one-stop operator, and CSBD has informed the SBBC that BWDB has selected Workforce Guidance Associates, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, as the contracted one-stop operator, which assists CSBD in coordination among the one-stop partners.

WIOA requires that each one-stop partner enter an MOU which describes the integration and coordination of each partner's program services.

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To better express the agreement between the Parties, CSBD and SBBC wish to amend the 2020 SBBC MOU as described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions, promises, covenants and obligations hereinafter set forth, CSBD and SBBC agree to amend the following provisions of the MOU:

- Paragraph 4, ONE STOP DELIVERY SYSTEM ("OSDS") SERVICES, subsection B, Access to Services, is amended to add a new sub paragraph "d." to acknowledge the manner in which services will be coordinated and delivered through the one-stop system pursuant to (34CFR §463.500(1), WIOA, Subtitle Chapter 1 §121(c)(2)(A)(I)) as follows:
 - d. Utilizing technology to facilitate access to the one-stop delivery system as reflected in the Infrastructure Funding Agreement attached as Exhibit A to the MOU.
- Paragraph 4, ONE STOP DELIVERY SYSTEM ("OSDS") SERVICES, subsection C, Coordinating Services, is amended to add a new sub paragraph "e." to acknowledge the requirements of providing accessibility and services to the disabled pursuant to 34CFR §361.505 and 34CFR §361.720 as follows:
 - e. Addressing the needs of workers, youth, and individuals with barriers to employment, including individuals with disabilities, by providing access to services appropriate to their needs, including access to technology and materials that are available through the one-stop delivery system.
- Paragraph 5, FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS, is amended to add a new subsection "D" to acknowledge the steps taken to reach consensus that the Parties followed the guidance for the State funding process pursuant to 34CFR §463.500(2)(i), 34CFR §463.755, 34CFR §463.720, WIOA, Subtitle B, Chapter 1 §121(c)(2)(A)(ii) as follows:
 - D. The Parties agree that negotiation of the Infrastructure Funding Agreement took place on a "level playing field" pursuant to United States Department of Labor Training and Employment Guidance Letter 17-16 and followed the local funding process. One-stop operating costs were identified, a one-stop operating budget was developed to allow for a technological presence, costs were determined and allocated, estimated partner contributions and preparation of the Infrastructure Funding Agreement was completed. As the Parties agreed to a technological presence rather than co-location the MOU and Infrastructure Funding Agreement was presented to each of the Parties' governing boards and was approved by the respective governing boards at publicly noticed meeting.
- 4. Paragraph 5, FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS is amended to add a new subsection "E" to clarify that CSBD is not

using in-kind costs to fund the infrastructure and operating costs of the onestop delivery system.

- E. CSBD has no third-party in-kind contributions for the operation of the one stop therefore none is included in Exhibit A, the Infrastructure Funding Agreement.
- 5. Paragraph 12, DISPUTE RESOLUTION, is amended by renumbering the existing paragraph to read paragraph "a." and to add a new paragraph "b." as follows:
 - b. In the event a consensus is not reached regarding infrastructure costs, this shall be reported to each partner's local governing entity, so that the governing entities can make an additional effort to reach agreement between the Parties. Should this effort fail the Parties will report their inability to reach consensus regarding the infrastructure costs to the Governor, who may invoke the State Funding Mechanism. In such instances, the Parties agree to abide by the Governor's determination.
- 6. Exhibit A, the Infrastructure Funding Agreement is amended to add the following language:

In the event a consensus is not reached regarding infrastructure costs, this shall be reported to each partner's local governing entity, so that the governing entities can make an additional effort to reach agreement between the Parties. Should this effort fail the Parties will report their inability to reach consensus regarding the infrastructure costs to the Governor, who may invoke the State Funding Mechanism. In such instances, the Parties agree to abide by the Governor's determination.

- 7. All provisions of said Agreement, which are not in conflict with this Amendment, shall continue to be enforced in accordance with the terms and conditions therein.
- Except as expressly stated in this Amendment, all other definitions, terms and conditions, provisions, paragraphs and exhibits of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and without change.
- 9. This Amendment and all its Exhibits/Attachments are made a part of said Agreement.
- 10. The effective date of this Amendment shall be the date on which it has been signed by all the Parties.

Exhibit A

Infrastructure Funding Agreement (IFA)

The purpose of this Infrastructure Funding Agreement is to delineate each Party's responsibilities for sharing of infrastructure and operating costs for the applicable one-stop center.

- THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY (SBBC) and CSBD recognize that infrastructure costs, in accordance with 20 CFR 678.500(b), 34 CFR 361.500(b) and 34 CFR 463.500(b) are applicable to all required partners, regardless of whether they are physically located in CSBD'S one-stop center. Pursuant to the United States Department of Labor's Training and Employment Guidance Letter No. 17- 16 (USDOL TEGL 17-16), each partner's contributions to the infrastructure costs, may vary, as these contributions are based on the proportionate use and relative benefit received, consistent with the partner programs' authorizing laws and regulations and the Uniform Guidance.
- Infrastructure costs are defined as non-personnel costs that are necessary for the general operation of the south Broward one-stop center. Non-personnel costs are defined by USDOL TEGL 17-16 and includes, but are not limited to:
 - a. Rental of the facilities
 - b. Utilities and maintenance;
 - c. Equipment, including assessment- related products and assistive technology for individuals with disabilities; and,
 - d. Technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities.
- 3. The SBBC has chosen to utilize technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities (WIOA sec. 121(h)(4), 20 CFR 678.700(a), 34 CFR 361.700(a), and 34 CFR 463.700(a)). The will provide all art, logos, and content to submit to CSBD for publication within the time provided by CSBD.
- 4. Upon the receipt of proper invoice(s) at least thirty (30) days prior to the payment due date as applicable or by the due dates below, THE SBBC will pay CSBD the total of Six Hundred Forty-six and 47/100 Dollars (\$646.47) in three (3) separate payments of Two Hundred Fifteen and 49/100 Dollars (\$215.49) for the following periods:
 - a. July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, payable by October 31, 2020. July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, payable by October 31, 2021.

b. July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, payable by October 31, 2022.

- The SBBC will pay for the costs associated with its participation in the one-stop center as described above, subject to Section 8, TERMINATION. The Parties may mutually negotiate costs at the time of subsequent written amendments, subject to Section 7, MODIFICATIONS.
- 6. In the event a consensus is not reached regarding infrastructure costs, this shall be reported to each partner's local governing entity, so that the governing entities can make an additional effort to reach agreement between the Parties. Should this effort fail the Parties will report their inability to reach consensus regarding the infrastructure costs to the Governor, who may invoke the State Funding Mechanism. In such instances, the Parties agree to abide by the Governor's determination.

By their signatures below, THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY agrees to be responsible for the costs associated with their participation in the one-stop which shall be paid by October 31st of each year until such time as the costs are renegotiated at which time the MOU and or attached IFA will be amended. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions, promises, covenants and obligations hereinafter set forth, CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD agree as follows:

1. PARTIES

The Parties to this MOU are CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD. The Parties acknowledge that the recitals above are true and correct.

2. PURPOSE

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The purpose of this MOU is to state how each of the Parties will:

A. Provide access, including access for individuals with barriers to employment, to Adult Literacy and post-secondary Career and Technical Education program services through the CareerSource Broward One-Stop Career Centers which are a part of the American Job Center network system.

B. Follow established processes for the referral of customers to each other when appropriate for the customer.

C. Follow established processes for sharing customer data in a manner that preserves customer confidentiality in accordance with governing laws and regulations and for sharing technology in a secure manner to provide coordinated services as appropriate for the customer.

D. Accomplish the purposes of this MOU in a non-discriminatory environment.

E. Support the infrastructure and operating costs of the CareerSource Broward One-Stop Career Center.

3. VISION

A. WIOA envisions an integrated and coordinated workforce delivery system. To accomplish the intent set forth in WIOA for the workforce development system, CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall work together with all the WIOA one-stop partners on system design and access, shared services and customers as appropriate, and shared costs as required under WIOA.

B. To accomplish the vision and goals set forth in WIOA, CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall:

a. Identify the customers' needs as the first priority with the focus on individualized and quality customer service.

b. Follow-through on cross-partner referrals and customer connections on a timely basis. c. Commit to continuous learning about each other and the other partners' programs leading to a better understanding of opportunities for coordination of services.

d. Recognize and respect each partner's constraints.

e. Be open to change.

4. ONE-STOP DELIVERY SYSTEM ("OSDS") SERVICES

A. Services provided through the OSDS. Services provided through the OSDS shall include:

a. WIOA Title I Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth Program services

b. Referral to WIOA Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act services

c. WIOA Title III Wagner-Peyser Act employment services

d. WIOA Title IV Vocational Rehabilitation program services

e. Referral to Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act funded programs

f. Older Americans Act, Title V, Senior Community Service Employment Program

g. Veterans programs

h. Trade Adjustment Assistance Act program services

i. Referral to Community Services Block Grant services

j. Unemployment Compensation

k. Temporary Assistance for Needy Families through Florida's Welfare Transition Program

I. Supplemental Nutrition Act Program

m. Referral to Youth/ Build U.S.A. program

n. Referral to Second Chance programs

B. Access to Services. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD will make their program services accessible through the OSDS by:

a. Exchanging participants' eligibility requirements for their workforce funding streams, identifying their program career services and designating services and activities which may be appropriate for integration into the OSDS.

b. Jointly developing and participating in training of frontline staff to assure an understanding of the activities, support services, and constraints applicable to joint partner workforce funding streams.

c. Coordinating outreach and recruitment through links on each other's websites where possible.

C. Coordinating Services. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall coordinate and deliver program services (including workforce services) as appropriate through the OSDS by:

a. Seeking opportunities to share resources and reduce duplication of activities to streamline services for customers and improve frontline staff efficiency such as by colocating in a comprehensive or affiliate one-stop location site.

b. Working together on enhancing employer engagement to build a demand-driven system, improve business services, and match participants with work-based learning opportunities.

c. Promoting continuous improvement through the coordination of staff training to provide frontline staff with information and knowledge regarding each other's services.

d. Participating in the OSDS consistent with the terms of this MOU and the requirements of the federal laws authorizing the program or activities and any related grant agreements.

D. Cross Referral. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall consider policies and procedures which would encourage the referral of customers to each other as appropriate by:

11. C.

a. Reviewing their individual program policies, procedures and processes and to align the policies, procedures, and processes to the extent allowed by each program's specific laws and regulations, to better serve customers through cross referral, sequential, or co-enrollment as may best benefit the customer.

b. Utilizing established methods for follow-up and reporting to each other on the services provided to the customer and the outcomes attained.

E. Information sharing. As it relates to SCHOOL BOARD's Disclosure of Education Records and Employee records:

a. Although no student education records shall be disclosed pursuant to this MOU, should CSBD come into contact with education records during the course of contracted responsibilities, these records are confidential and protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and state laws and may not be used or re-disclosed. Any use or re-disclosure may violate applicable federal and state laws. Likewise, no employee records shall be disclosed by SCHOOL BOARD to CSBD. Should CSBD come into contact with employee, it may not be re-disclosed except as required or permitted by law.

b. Confidentiality of Education Records and Employee Records. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this MOU, CareerSource Broward shall:

I. fully comply with the requirements of Sections 1002.22, 1002.221, and 1002.222, Florida Statutes; the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C § 1232g (FERPA) and its implementing regulations (34 C.F.R. Part 99), and any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of education records and employee records;

II. hold any education records and employee records in strict confidence and not use or redisclose same except as required by this MOU or as required or permitted by law unless the parent of each student or a student age 18 years or older whose education records or employee records are to be shared provides prior written consent for their release;

III. ensure that, at all times, all of its employees who have access to any education records or employee records during the term of their employment shall abide strictly by its obligations under this MOU, and that access to education records and employee records is limited only to its employees that require the information to carry out the responsibilities under this MOU and shall provide said list of employees to SCHOOL BOARD upon request;

IV. safeguard education records and employee records through administrative, physical and technological standards to ensure that adequate controls are in place to protect the

education records and information in accordance with FERPA's privacy requirements, and employee records in accordance with applicable laws; and

V. utilize the education records and employee records solely for the purposes of providing products and services as contemplated under this MOU; and shall not share, publish, sell, distribute, target advertise, or display education records or employee records to any third party.

F. Accessibility. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall follow the same or similar processes to serve individuals with barriers, including consideration of technological tools for individuals with disabilities in each of the one-stop centers and affiliate locations.

5. FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS

A. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD have a commitment to contribute to the infrastructure costs of the one-stop system in the local workforce area.

B. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD agree contribute to the operating costs, proportionate use and an agreed upon methodology.

C. This MOU complies with the one-stop infrastructure costs through the use of technology as described in the Infrastructure Funding Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

6. TERM

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This MOU shall commence retroactively on July 1st, 2020 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30th, 2023, unless the MOU is terminated by either Party in accordance with the terms set forth below and in Section 8 (TERMINATION).

7. MODIFICATION

A. The MOU shall be reviewed at least once every three (3) years and shall be modified to reflect changes in the terms, conditions or scope of work.

B. Within ninety (90) days prior to the termination date of this MOU, the Parties shall review the MOU and negotiate any changes to the provisions of this MOU. The review shall include:

a. A collaborative evaluation of the effectiveness of operations pursuant to this MOU and infrastructure cost sharing methodologies

b. This MOU may be amended or modified by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written amendment, executed by the parties.

8. TERMINATION

A. Either Party may terminate this MOU for convenience, by giving thirty (30) days' prior written notification pursuant to Section 9 (NOTICES). SCHOOL BOARD and CSBD's President may issue any notice of termination authorized by this MOU.

B. In the event of termination during any period of time that a MOU is required by WIOA or any related grant agreement requiring this MOU, the Parties shall renegotiate a mutually acceptable replacement MOU.

9. NOTICES

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A. All notices required to be given to CSBD under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to CSBD at its office located at 2890 West Cypress Creek Rd., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309, addressed to the CSBD President/CEO.

B. All notices required to be given to SCHOOL BOARD under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to SCHOOL BOARD at its office located at 600 SE Third Ave., Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33301.

C. All notices shall be in writing, including email.

10. NON-DISCRIMINATION

A. Each Party shall not discriminate, harass, or allow harassment against any one-stop applicant or customer on the basis of gender, race, color, ancestry, religion, political affiliation, pregnancy, national origin, veteran status, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition(s), age, sexual orientation, or marital status.

B. The Parties shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and its amendments, as well as with other applicable regulations and guidelines promulgated thereunder.

11. GRIEVANCE AND COMPLAINTS

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY and CSBD will utilize the grievance and complaint procedures applicable to non-discrimination complaints as outlined in WIOA for mutual customers utilizing the one-stop career center.

12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The parties agree to try to resolve disputes at the lowest level, starting with the site supervisor(s) and staff. If issues cannot be resolved at this level, they shall be referred to the management staff of the respective partner and the operator, for discussion and resolution.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

A. CSBD and SCHOOL BOARD shall coordinate communications with the press, television, radio, or any other form of media regarding mutual responsibilities and activities under this MOU. Participation of each Party in press/media presentations will be determined by each Party's public relations policies.

B. References to the local OSDS shall utilize the CSBD logo developed by the State of Florida and the American Job Center logo developed by the United States Department of Labor as authorized in the WIOA.

14. INDEMNIFICATION

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As an agency defined in Chapter 768.28 Florida Statutes, SCHOOL BOARD agrees to be fully responsible for acts and omissions of its agents or employees to the extent permitted by law. Nothing herein is intended to serve, as a waiver of sovereign immunity as applicable. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by SCHOOL BOARD as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of this MOU, or any part thereof. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this MOU.

Each party to this MOU agrees to indemnify itself to the extent permitted by law and shall hold the other party harmless, and neither party shall be responsible to the other party for actions of its officers, agents, servants, and employees with respect to any and all claims, losses, liabilities, and expenditures of any kind, including attorney fees, court costs, and expenses, caused by a negligent act or omission of either party, its employees, agents, servants, or officers, or accruing, resulting from, or related to the subject matter of this MOU including, without limitation, any and all claims, demands, or causes of action of any nature whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or property.

The Parties agree to maintain such insurance as is appropriate to its own organization. Each Party agrees to conduct itself in accordance with the tenets of good faith in the execution of their responsibilities.

15. AGENCY OR EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

No provision of this MOU shall be construed as creating an agency or employment relationship between the Parties. The Parties agree that they are responsible for the actions of its representatives and employees with regard to all aspects of this MOU.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Parties shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, rules, or procedures, all of which are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of the terms and conditions of this MOU.

17. SIGNATURE IN COUNTERPARTS

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This MOU may be executed in multiple identical counterparts, all of which shall constitute one agreement.

18. ACCEPTANCE OF SCANNED SIGNATURES

Each counterpart of this MOU shall be considered valid if the person authorized to sign for each Party has applied his or her actual signature to the counterpart or the counterpart contains a scanned image (e.g., pdf, or tiff file extension name) of such signature delivered by the representative described in Section 9 as an attachment to the electronic mail (email). Such scanned signature shall be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature. Exhibit A

Infrastructure Funding Agreement (IFA)

The purpose of this Infrastructure Funding Agreement is to delineate each Party's responsibilities for sharing of infrastructure and operating costs for the applicable one-stop center.

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA and CSBD recognize that infrastructure costs, in accordance with 20 CFR 678.500(b), 34 CFR 361.500(b), and 34 CFR 463.500(b) are applicable to all required partners, regardless of whether they are physically located in CSBD'S one-stop center. Pursuant to the United States Department of Labor's Training and Employment Guidance Letter No. 17-16 (USDOL TEGL 17-16), each partner's contributions to the infrastructure costs, may vary, as these contributions are based on the proportionate use and relative benefit received, consistent with the partner programs' authorizing laws and regulations and the Uniform Guidance.

Infrastructure costs are defined as non-personnel costs that are necessary for the general operation of the south Broward one-stop center. Non-personnel costs are defined by USDOL TEGL 17-16 and includes, but are not limited to:

• Rental of the facilities;

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• Utilities and maintenance;

• Equipment, including assessment- related products and assistive technology for individuals with disabilities; and,

• Technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities.

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA has chosen to utilize technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities (WIOA sec. 121(h)(4), 20 CFR 678.700(a), 34 CFR 361.700(a), and 34 CFR 463.700(a)).

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA will provide all art, logos, and content to submit to CSBD for publication within the time provided by CSBD.

Upon the receipt of proper invoice(s) at least thirty (30) days prior to the payment due date as applicable or by the due dates below, THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA will pay CSBD the total of Six Hundred Forty-six and 47/100 Dollars (\$646.47) in three (3) separate payments of Two Hundred Fifteen and 49/100 Dollars (\$215.49) for the following periods:

- (1) July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, payable by October 31, 2020.
- (2) July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, payable by October 31, 2021.
- (3) July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, payable by October 31, 2022.

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA will pay for the costs associated with its participation in the one-stop center as described above, subject to Section 8 (TERMINATION) of the MOU. The Parties may mutually negotiate costs at the time of subsequent written amendments, subject to Section 7 (MODIFICATIONS) of the MOU.

By their signatures below, THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA agrees to be responsible for the costs associated with its participation in the one-stop which shall be paid by October 31st of each year of the associated MOU term until such time as the costs are renegotiated at which time the MOU and/or IFA will be amended.

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

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

CAREERSOURCE BROWARD

and

OPPORTUNITIES INDUSTRIALIZATION CENTERS OF SOUTH FLORIDA

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between CareerSource Broward ("CSBD") as the administrative entity for the CSBD Council of Elected Officials ("Council") and for the Broward Workforce Development Board, Inc. ("BWDB") and the Opportunities Industrialization Centers of South Florida (hereinafter referred to as "OIC"), a one-stop partner under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, P.L. 113-128 ("WIOA") as a result of their grantee status through the award of YouthBuild and Second Chance program grants.

RECITALS

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, P.L. 113-128 as codified in 20 C.F.R. Part 678 ("WIOA") requires that the Broward Workforce Development Board, Inc., a not-for-profit Florida corporation ("BWDB"), enter into an MOU with each one-stop partner identified in the legislation.

CSBD serves as the administrative entity for both the BWDB and the Council of Elected Officials ("Council") in Workforce Development Area 22, which encompasses OIC, Florida and is authorized to enter this MOU on behalf of the BWDB.

OIC is a one-stop partner identified in WIOA Sec. 121 because they provide access to programs and activities carried out by one-stop partners.

WIOA requires the BWDB to competitively select a one-stop operator, and CSBD has informed OIC that BWDB has selected Workforce Guidance Associates, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, as the contracted one-stop operator in OIC, which assists CSBD in coordination among the one-stop partners.

WIOA requires that each one-stop partner shall enter an MOU which describes the integration and coordination of each partner's program services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions, promises, covenants and obligations hereinafter set forth, CSBD and OIC agree as follows:

1. PARTIES

The Parties to this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") are CSBD and OIC. The Parties acknowledge that the recitals above are true and correct.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to state how each of the Parties will:

- A. Provide access to their programs, CSBD to the WIOA, and other workforce funding streams under their administration; and OIC to their Pathways (JMF), Pathways (federal), and WWEP Transfer Act of 2006, 29 USC 17501 April 9, 2008 and other grant programs.
- B. Follow established processes for the referral of customers to each other when appropriate for the customer.
- C. Follow established processes for sharing customer data in a manner that preserves customer confidentiality in accordance with governing laws and regulations and for sharing technology in a secure manner to provide coordinated services as appropriate for the customer.
- D. Accomplish the purposes of this MOU in a non-discriminatory environment.
- E. Support the infrastructure and operating costs of the CareerSource Broward One- Stop Career Center.

3. VISION

- A. WIOA envisions an integrated and coordinated workforce delivery system. To accomplish the intent set forth in WIOA for the workforce development system, CSBD and OIC shall work together with all the WIOA one-stop partners on system design and access, shared services and customers as appropriate, and shared costs as required under WIOA.
- B. To accomplish the vision and goals set forth in WIOA, CSBD and OIC shall:
 - a. Identify the customer's needs as the first priority with the focus on individualized and quality customer service.
 - b. Follow-through on cross-partner referrals and customer connections on a timely basis.
 - c. Commit to continuous learning about each other and the other partners' programs leading to a better understanding of opportunities for coordination of services.

- d. Recognize and respect each partner's constraints.
- e. Be open to change.

4. ONE-STOP DELIVERY SYSTEM ("OSDS") SERVICES

- A. Services provided through the OSDS. Services provided through the OSDS shall include:
 - a. WIOA Title I Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth Program services
 - b. Referral to WIOA Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act services
 - c. WIOA Title III Wagner- Peyser Act employment services
 - d. WIOA Title IV Vocational Rehabilitation program services
 - e. Referral to Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act funded programs
 - f. Older Americans Act, Title V, Senior Community Service Employment Program
 - g. Veterans programs
 - h. Trade Adjustment Assistance Act program services
 - i. Referral to Community Services Block Grant services
 - j. Unemployment Compensation
 - k. Temporary Assistance for Needy Families through Florida's Welfare Transition Program
 - I. Supplemental Nutrition Act Program
 - m. Referral to Youth Build U.S.A. program
 - n. Referral to Second Chance programs
 - At this time HUD Employment and Training, Jobs Corps, and Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Programs are not offered in the workforce development area.
- **B**. Access to Services. CSBD and OIC will make their program services accessible through the OSDS by:
 - a. Exchanging participants' eligibility requirements for their workforce funding streams, identifying their program career services and designating services and activities which may be appropriate for integration into the OSDS.
 - b. Jointly developing and participating in training of frontline staff to assure an understanding of the activities, support services, and constraints applicable to joint partner workforce funding streams.
 - c. Coordinating outreach and recruitment through links on each other's websites where possible.
 - d. Collaborate data share agreement such as demographics, job placement, success stories and other intake related information.
- **C. Coordinating Services**. CSBD and OIC shall coordinate and deliver program services (including workforce services) as appropriate through the OSDS by:

- a. Seeking opportunities to share resources to streamline activities as appropriate to each partner's funding stream and the needs of the individual participants.
- b. Working together on enhancing employer engagement to build a demand-driven system.
- c. Promoting continuous improvement through the coordination of staff training to provide frontline staff with information and knowledge regarding each other's services.
- d. Participating in the OSDS consistent with the terms of this MOU and the requirements of the federal laws authorizing the program or activities and any related grant agreements.
- **D. Cross Referral**. CSBD and OIC shall consider policies and procedures which would encourage the referral of customers to each other as appropriate by:
 - a. Reviewing their individual program policies, procedures and processes and to align the policies, procedures, and processes to the extent allowed by each program's specific laws and regulations, to better serve customers through cross referral, sequential, or co-enrollment as may best benefit the customer.
 - b. Utilizing established methods for follow-up and reporting to each other on the services provided to the customer and the outcomes attained.
- **E. Information Sharing.** CSBD and OIC shall explore and identify mechanisms for sharing information about their common customers by agreeing to a common release form to be executed by common customers, as approved by OIC, and CSBD's President.
 - a. The Parties shall adhere to appropriate internal controls and security to protect the privacy of their common customers.
 - b. The Parties shall comply with the confidentiality provisions of the respective statutes applicable to their funding streams.
- **F. Accessibility**. CSBD and OIC shall follow the same or similar processes to serve individuals with barriers, including consideration of technological tools for individuals with disabilities in each of the one-stop centers and affiliate locations.

5. FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS

- A. CSBD and OIC agree to support infrastructure and operating costs of the one stop system in accordance with the cost principles of 2 CFR 200 et al, proportionate to OIC's use of the one stop and an agreed upon methodology.
- B. CSBD and OIC have opted for Option 3 as presented in USDOL Training and Employment Guidance 16-16 which provides for CSBD and OIC " making available a direct linkage through technology such as their websites and telephones to a program staff member who can provide meaningful information or services.

C. If either of the parties are unable to agree on the contributions to the one-stop infrastructure and operating costs, they may appeal to the Governor. If the appeal results in a change to partner's contributions, the parties agree to modify and update the MOU to reflect the final one-stop partner infrastructure cost contributions.

6. TERM

This MOU shall commence on July 1st, 2020 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30th, 2023, unless the MOU is terminated by either party in accordance with the terms set forth below and in Section 8 (TERMINATION).

7. MODIFICATION

- A. The MOU shall be reviewed at least once every three years and shall be modified to reflect changes in the terms, conditions or scope of work.
- B. Within ninety (90) days prior to the termination date of this MOU, the Parties shall review the MOU and negotiate any changes to the provisions of this MOU. The review shall include:
 - a. A collaborative evaluation of the effectiveness of operations pursuant to this MOU and infrastructure cost sharing methodologies
 - b. This MOU may be amended or modified by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written amendment, executed by the parties.

8. TERMINATION

- A. Either party may terminate this MOU for convenience, by giving thirty (30) days' prior written notification via USPS mail or electronic means with a delivery receipt to the other party.
- B. In the event of termination during any period of time that a MOU is required by WIOA or any related grant agreement requiring this MOU, the Parties shall renegotiate a mutually acceptable replacement MOU.

9. NOTICES

- A. All notices required to be given to CSBD under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to CSBD at its office located at 2890 West Cypress Creek Rd., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309, addressed to the CSBD President/CEO.
- B. All notices required to be given to OIC under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to the OIC at its office located at 3407 NW 9 Avenue, Suite 100, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33309 addressed to the President/CEO.

C. All notices shall be in writing, including email.

10. NON DISCRIMINATION

- A. Each Party shall not discriminate, harass, or allow harassment against any one-stop applicant or customer on the basis of gender, race, color, ancestry, religion, political affiliation, pregnancy, national origin, veteran status, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition(s), age, sexual orientation, or marital status.
- B. The Parties shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and its amendments, as well as with other applicable regulations and guidelines promulgated thereunder.

11. GRIEVANCE AND COMPLAINTS

OIC and CSBD will utilize the grievance and complaint procedures applicable to nondiscrimination complaints as outlined in WIOA for mutual customers utilizing the one-stop career center.

12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The parties agree to try to resolve disputes at the lowest level, starting with the site supervisor(s) and staff. If issues cannot be resolved at this level, they shall be referred to the management staff of the respective partner and the operator, for discussion and resolution.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

CSBD and OIC agree that references to the local OSDS shall utilize the CSBD logo developed by the State of Florida and the American Job Center logo developed by the United States Department of Labor as authorized in the WIOA.

14. INDEMNIFICATION

As an agency defined in Chapter 768.28 Florida Statutes, OIC agrees to be fully responsible for acts and omissions of its agents or employees to the extent permitted by law. Nothing herein is intended to serve, as a waiver of sovereign immunity as applicable. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by CSBD as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of this MOU, or any part thereof. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this MOU.

Each party to this MOU agrees to indemnify itself to the extent permitted by law and shall hold the other party harmless, and neither party shall be responsible to the other party for actions of its officers, agents, servants, and employees with respect to any and all claims, losses, liabilities, and expenditures of any kind, including attorney fees, court costs, and expenses, caused by a negligent act or omission of either party, its employees, agents, servants, or officers, or accruing, resulting from, or related to the subject matter of this MOU including, without limitation, any and all claims, demands, or causes of action of any nature whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or property.

The parties agree to maintain such insurance as is appropriate to its own organization. Each party agrees to conduct itself in accordance with the tenets of good faith in the execution of their responsibilities.

15. AGENCY OR EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

No provision of this MOU shall be construed as creating an agency or employment relationship between the Parties. The Parties agree that they are responsible for the actions of its representatives and employees with regard to all aspects of this MOU.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Parties shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, rules, or procedures, all of which are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of the terms and conditions of this MOU.

17. SIGNATURE IN COUNTERPARTS

This MOU may be executed in multiple identical counterparts, all of which shall constitute one agreement.

18. ACCEPTANCE OF SCANNED SIGNATURES

Each counterpart of this MOU shall be considered valid if the person authorized to sign for each Party has applied his or her actual signature to the counterpart or the counterpart contains a scanned image (e.g., pdf, or tiff file extension name) of such signature delivered by the representative described in Section 9 as an attachment to the electronic mail (email). Such scanned signature shall be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature. Exhibit A

Infrastructure Funding Agreement (IFA)

The purpose of this Infrastructure Funding Agreement is to delineate each Party's responsibilities for sharing of infrastructure and operating costs for the applicable one-stop center.

CSBD and OIC recognize that infrastructure costs, in accordance with 20 CFR 678.500(b), 34 CFR 361.500(b), and 34 CFR 463.500(b) are applicable to all required partners, regardless of whether they are physically located in CSBD'S one-stop center. Pursuant to the United States Department of Labor's Training and Employment Guidance Letter No. 17-16 (USDOL TEGL 17-16), each partner's contributions to the infrastructure costs, may vary, as these contributions are based on the proportionate use and relative benefit received, consistent with the partner programs' authorizing laws and regulations and the Uniform Guidance.

Infrastructure costs are defined as non-personnel costs that are necessary for the general operation of the south Broward one-stop center. Non-personnel costs are defined by USDOL TEGL 17-16 and includes, but are not limited to:

- Rental of the facilities;
- Utilities and maintenance;
- Equipment, including assessment- related products and assistive

technology for individuals with disabilities; and,

• Technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including

technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities.

OIC of South Florida has chosen to utilize technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities (WIOA sec. 121(h)(4), 20 CFR 678.700(a), 34 CFR 361.700(a), and 34 CFR 463.700(a)). This will be done through a web page in which OIC of South Florida will provide information about the services and ways in which to access those services. CSBD will host the web page at a cost of \$215.49 per year.

Upon the receipt of proper invoice(s) at least thirty (30) days prior to the payment due date as applicable or by the due dates below, OIC of South Florida will pay CSBD the total of Six Hundred Forty-six and 47/100 Dollars (\$646.47) in three (3) separate payments of Two Hundred Fifteen and 49/100 Dollars (\$215.49) for the following periods:

- (1) July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, payable by October 31, 2020.
- (2) July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, payable by October 31, 2021.
- (3) July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, payable by October 31, 2022.

OIC will pay for the costs associated with its participation in the one-stop center. as described above, subject to Section 8 (TERMINATION). The Parties may mutually negotiate costs at the time of subsequent written amendments, subject to Section 7 (MODIFICATIONS).

By their signatures below, OIC of South Florida agrees to be responsible for the costs associated with their participation in the one-stop which shall be paid by October 31st of each year until such time as the costs are renegotiated at which time the MOU and or attached IFA will be amended.

WIOA requires that each one-stop partner shall enter an MOU which describes the integration and coordination of each partner's program services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions, promises, covenants and obligations hereinafter set forth, CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE agree as follows:



1. PARTIES

The purpose of this MOU is to state how each of the Parties will:

A. Provide access, including access for individuals with barriers to employment, to Adult Literacy and post-secondary Career and Technical Education program services through the CareerSource Broward One-Stop Career Centers which are a part of the American Job Center network system.

B. Follow established processes for the referral of customers to each other when appropriate for the customer.

C. Follow established processes for sharing customer data in a manner that preserves customer confidentiality in accordance with governing laws and regulations and for sharing technology in a secure manner to provide coordinated services as appropriate for the customer.

D. Accomplish the purposes of this MOU in a non-discriminatory environment.

E. Support the infrastructure and operating costs of the CareerSource Broward One-Stop Career Center.

3. VISION

A. WIOA envisions an integrated and coordinated workforce delivery system. To accomplish the intent set forth in WIOA for the workforce development system, CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall work together with all the WIOA one-stop partners on system design and access, shared services and customers as appropriate, and shared costs as required under WIOA.

B. To accomplish the vision and goals set forth in WIOA, CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall:

a. Identify the customer's needs as the first priority with the focus on individualized and quality customer service.

b. Follow-through on cross-partner referrals and customer connections on a timely basis.

c. Commit to continuous learning about each other and the other partners' programs leading to a better understanding of opportunities for coordination of services.

d. Recognize and respect each partner's constraints.

e. Be open to change.

4. ONE-STOP DELIVERY SYSTEM ("OSDS") SERVICES

A. **Services provided through the OSDS**. Services provided through the OSDS shall include:

a. WIOA Title I Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth Program services

b. Referral to WIOA Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act services

c. WIOA Title III Wagner- Peyser Act employment services

d. WIOA Title IV Vocational Rehabilitation program services

e. Referral to Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act funded programs

f. Older Americans Act, Title V, Senior Community Service Employment Program

g. Veterans programs

h. Trade Adjustment Assistance Act program services

i. Referral to Community Services Block Grant services

j. Unemployment Compensation

k. Temporary Assistance for Needy Families through Florida's Welfare Transition Program

I. Supplemental Nutrition Act Program

m. Referral to Youth/ Build U.S.A. program

n. Referral to Second Chance programs

B. **Access to Services**. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE will make their program services accessible through the OSDS by:

a. Exchanging participants' eligibility requirements for their workforce funding streams, identifying their program career services and designating services and activities which may be appropriate for integration into the OSDS.

b. Jointly developing and participating in training of frontline staff to assure an understanding of the activities, support services, and constraints applicable to joint partner workforce funding streams.

c. Coordinating outreach and recruitment through links on each other's websites where possible.

C. Coordinating Services. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall coordinate and deliver program services (including workforce services) as appropriate through the OSDS by:

a. Seeking opportunities to share resources and reduce duplication of activities to streamline services for customers and improve frontline staff efficiency such as by co-locating in a comprehensive or affiliate one-stop location site.

b. Working together on enhancing employer engagement to build a demand-driven system, improve business services, and match participants with work-based learning opportunities.

c. Promoting continuous improvement through the coordination of staff training to provide frontline staff with information and knowledge regarding each other's services.



d. Participating in the OSDS consistent with the terms of this MOU and the requirements of the federal laws authorizing the program or activities and any related grant agreements.

D. **Cross Referral**. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall consider policies and procedures which would encourage the referral of customers to each other as appropriate by:

a. Reviewing their individual program policies, procedures and processes and to align the policies, procedures, and processes to the extent allowed by each program's specific laws and regulations, to better serve customers through cross referral, sequential, or co-enrollment as may best benefit the customer.

b. Utilizing established methods for follow-up and reporting to each other on the services provided to the customer and the outcomes attained.

E. **Information Sharing**. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall explore and identify mechanisms for sharing information about their common customers by agreeing to a common release form to be executed by common customers, as approved by BROWARD COLLEGE, and CSBD's President.

a. The Parties shall adhere to appropriate internal controls and security to protect the privacy of their common customers.

b. The Parties shall comply with the confidentiality provisions of the respective statutes applicable to their funding streams.

F. **Accessibility**. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall follow the same or similar processes to serve individuals with barriers, including consideration of technological tools for individuals with disabilities in each of the one-stop centers and affiliate locations.

5. FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS

A. CSBD and Broward College have a commitment to contribute to the infrastructure costs of the one-stop system in the local workforce area.

B. CSBD and Broward College agree contribute to the operating costs, proportionate use and an agreed upon methodology.

C. This Memorandum of Understanding complies with the one-stop infrastructure costs through the use of technology. See Attachment "A".

6. TERM

This MOU shall commence on July 1st, 2020 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30th, 2023, unless the MOU is terminated by either Party in accordance with the terms set forth below and in Section 8 (TERMINATION).



7. MODIFICATION

A. The MOU shall be reviewed at least once every three years and shall be modified to reflect changes in the terms, conditions or scope of work.

B. Within ninety (90) days prior to the termination date of this MOU, the Parties shall review the MOU and negotiate any changes to the provisions of this MOU. The review shall include:

a. A collaborative evaluation of the effectiveness of operations pursuant to this MOU and infrastructure cost sharing methodologies

b. This MOU may be amended or modified by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written amendment, executed by the parties.

8. TERMINATION

A. Either Party may terminate this MOU for convenience, by giving thirty (30) days' prior written notification pursuant to Section 9 (NOTICES). Broward College and CSBD's President may issue any notice of termination authorized by this MOU.

B. In the event of termination during any period of time that a MOU is required by WIOA or any related grant agreement requiring this MOU, the Parties shall renegotiate a mutually acceptable replacement MOU.

9. NOTICES

A. All notices required to be given to CSBD under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to CSBD at its office located at 2890 West Cypress Creek Rd., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309, addressed to the CSBD President/CEO.

B. All notices required to be given to Broward College under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to the President of Broward College or his/her designee at its office located at 111 East Las Olas Boulevard, 12th Floor Administration Offices, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33301 and 111 East Las Olas Boulevard, Office of the General Counsel-5th Floor, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33301.

C. All notices shall be in writing, including email.

10. NON DISCRIMINATION

A. Each Party shall not discriminate, harass, or allow harassment against any one-stop applicant or customer on the basis of gender, race, color, ancestry, religion, political affiliation, pregnancy, national origin, veteran status, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition(s), age, sexual orientation, or marital status.

B. The Parties shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and its amendments, as well as with other applicable regulations and guidelines promulgated thereunder.

11. GRIEVANCE AND COMPLAINTS

BROWARD COLLEGE and CSBD will utilize the grievance and complaint procedures applicable to non-discrimination complaints as outlined in WIOA for mutual customers utilizing the one-stop career center.

12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The parties agree to try to resolve disputes at the lowest level, starting with the site supervisor(s) and staff. If issues cannot be resolved at this level, they shall be referred to the management staff of the respective partner and the operator, for discussion and resolution.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

A. CSBD and BROWARD COLLEGE shall coordinate communications with the press, television, radio, or any other form of media regarding mutual responsibilities and activities under this MOU. Participation of each Party in press/media presentations will be determined by each Party's public relations policies.

B. References to the local OSDS shall utilize the CSBD logo developed by the State of Florida and the American Job Center logo developed by the United States Department of Labor as authorized in the WIOA.

14. INDEMNIFICATION

As an agency defined in Chapter 768.28 Florida Statutes, Broward College agrees to be fully responsible for acts and omissions of its agents or employees to the extent permitted by law. Nothing herein is intended to serve, as a waiver of sovereign immunity as applicable. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by Broward College as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of this MOU, or any part thereof. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this MOU.

Each party to this MOU agrees to indemnify itself to the extent permitted by law and shall hold the other party harmless, and neither party shall be responsible to the other party for actions of its officers, agents, servants, and employees with respect to any and all claims, losses, liabilities, and expenditures of any kind, including attorney fees, court costs, and expenses, caused by a negligent act or omission of either party, its employees, agents, servants, or officers, or accruing, resulting from, or related to the subject matter of this MOU including, without limitation, any and all claims,



demands, or causes of action of any nature whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or property.

The parties agree to maintain such insurance as is appropriate to its own organization. Each party agrees to conduct itself in accordance with the tenets of good faith in the execution of their responsibilities.

15. AGENCY OR EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

No provision of this MOU shall be construed as creating an agency or employment relationship between the Parties. The Parties agree that they are responsible for the actions of its representatives and employees with regard to all aspects of this MOU.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Parties shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, rules, or procedures, all of which are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of the terms and conditions of this MOU.

17. SIGNATURE IN COUNTERPARTS

This MOU may be executed in multiple identical counterparts, all of which shall constitute one agreement.

18. ACCEPTANCE OF SCANNED SIGNATURES

Each counterpart of this MOU shall be considered valid if the person authorized to sign for each Party has applied his or her actual signature to the counterpart or the counterpart contains a scanned image (e.g., pdf, or tiff file extension name) of such signature delivered by the representative described in Section 9 as an attachment to the electronic mail (email). Such scanned signature shall be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature.

Infrastructure Funding Agreement (IFA)

The purpose of this Infrastructure Funding Agreement is to delineate each Party's responsibilities for sharing of infrastructure and operating costs for the applicable one-stop center.

BROWARD COLLEGE and **CSBD** recognize that infrastructure costs, in accordance with 20 CFR 678.500(b), 34 CFR 361.500(b), and 34 CFR 463.500(b) are applicable to all required partners, regardless of whether they are physically located in CSBD'S one-stop center. Pursuant to the United States Department of Labor's Training and Employment Guidance Letter No. 17-16 (USDOL TEGL 17-16), each partner's contributions to the infrastructure costs, may vary, as these contributions are based on the proportionate use and relative benefit received, consistent with the partner programs' authorizing laws and regulations and the Uniform Guidance.

Infrastructure costs are defined as non-personnel costs that are necessary for the general operation of the south Broward one-stop center. Non-personnel costs are defined by USDOL TEGL 17-16 and includes, but are not limited to:

- Rental of the facilities;
- Utilities and maintenance;

• Equipment, including assessment- related products and assistive technology for individuals with disabilities; and,

• Technology to facilitate access to the one-stop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities.

BROWARD COLLEGE has chosen to utilize technology to facilitate access to the onestop center, including technology used for the center's planning and outreach activities (WIOA sec. 121(h)(4), 20 CFR 678.700(a), 34 CFR 361.700(a), and 34 CFR 463.700(a)).

BROWARD COLLEGE will provide all art, logos, and content to submit to CSBD for publication within the time provided by CSBD.

Upon the receipt of proper invoice(s) at least thirty (30) days prior to the payment due date as applicable or by the due dates below, BROWARD COLLEGE will pay CSBD the total of Six Hundred Forty-six and 47/100 Dollars (\$646.47) in three (3) separate payments of Two Hundred Fifteen and 49/100 Dollars (\$215.49) for the following periods:

- (1) July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, payable by October 31, 2020.
- (2) July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, payable by October 31, 2021.
- (3) July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, payable by October 31, 2022.

BROWARD COLLEGE will pay for the costs associated with its participation in the onestop center. as described above, subject to Section 8 (TERMINATION). The Parties



may mutually negotiate costs at the time of subsequent written amendments, subject to Section 7 (MODIFICATIONS).

By their signatures below, Broward College agrees to be responsible for the costs associated with their participation in the one-stop which shall be paid by October 31st of each year until such time as the costs are renegotiated at which time the MOU and or attached IFA will be amended.

 - b. Establishing a method for follow-up and reporting to each other on the services provided to the customer and the outcomes attained.
- **D.** Information Sharing. CSBD and VR agree to explore and identify mechanisms for sharing information about their common customers by agreeing to a common release form to be executed by common customers.
 - **a.** The parties agree to implement appropriate internal controls and security to protect the privacy of their common customers.
 - **b.** The parties agree to comply with the confidentiality provisions of the

respective statutes applicable to their funding streams.

E. Accessibility. CSBD and VR agree to share information regarding the use of technological tools for individuals with barriers and/or disabilities so as to provide accessible services in each of the one-stop and affiliate locations.

5. FUNDING OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND OPERATING COSTS

- A. CSBD and VR commit to contributing to the infrastructure costs of the one-stop system in local workforce area 22.
- B. CSBD and VR commit to contribute to the operating costs proportionate to each other's use of one-stop resources and an agreed upon methodology.
- C. VR is collocated with the one-stop center for Broward and currently leases office space from CSBD. CSBD and VR agree that the rent paid by VR for the operation of their office within the one-stop center constitutes their appropriate and proportionate contribution to the funding of infrastructure costs as contemplated by WIOA.
- D. If the above described collocation changes and the parties are unable to agree on the contributions to the one-stop infrastructure and operating costs, they agree that they may appeal using the process established by the Governor. If the appeal results in a change to either party's contributions the parties agree to modify and update the MOU to reflect the final one-stop partner infrastructure cost contributions

6. TERM

This MOU shall commence on the date of execution by each of the parties and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30th, 2023, and may be renewed for an additional three-year term. This MOU may be terminated by either party in accordance with the terms set forth below. Neither this MOU nor any provision hereof may be changed or amended orally, but only by an instrument in writing signed by all of the parties to this MOU.

7. MODIFICATION

- A. The MOU shall be reviewed at least once every three years and shall be modified to reflect changes in the terms, conditions or scope of work.
- B. Within ninety (90) days prior to the termination date of this MOU, the

Parties shall review the MOU and negotiate any changes to the provisions of this MOU. The review shall include:

- a. A collaborative evaluation of the effectiveness of operations pursuant to this MOU,
- b. Infrastructure cost sharing methodologies
- C. This MOU may be amended or modified by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written amendment, executed by the parties.

8. TERMINATION

- A. Either party may terminate this MOU for convenience, by giving thirty (30) days written notification via USPS mail or electronic means with a delivery receipt to the other party.
- B. In the event of termination while the requirements of this MOU are governed by WIOA, the parties agree to renegotiate this MOU.

9. NOTICE

- A. All notices required to be given to CSBD under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to CSBD at its office located at 2890 West Cypress Creek Rd., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309, addressed to the CSBD President/CEO.
- B. All notices required to be given to VR under this MOU shall be sufficient when hand delivered or mailed to Cynthia Gaber at 7771 West Oakland Park Blvd, Sunrise, FL 33016.
- C. All notices shall be in writing, this includes email with a delivery and read receipt.

10. NON DISCRIMINATION

A. The parties agree that they shall not unlawfully discriminate, harass or allow harassment against any one-stop applicant due to gender, race, color, ancestry, religion, national origin, veteran status, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition(s), age, sexual orientation or marital status. B. The parties agree to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and its amendments, as well as with other applicable regulations and guidelines promulgated thereunder.

11. GRIEVANCE AND COMPLAINTS

The parties agrees to utilize the grievance and complaint procedures applicable to non-discrimination complaints as outlined in WIOA for mutual customers utilizing the one-stop career center.

12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The parties agree to try to resolve disputes at the lowest level, starting with the site supervisor(s) and staff. If issues cannot be resolved at this level, they shall be referred to the management staff of the respective partner and the operator, for discussion and resolution.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

- A. CSBD and VR shall coordinate communications with the press, television, radio or any other form of media regarding mutual responsibilities and activities under this MOU. Participation of each party in press/media presentations will be determined by each party's public relations policies.
- B. CSBD and VR agree that references to the local one-stop system shall utilize the CareerSource Broward logo developed and required by the State of Florida and the America's Job Center logo developed and required by the United States Department of Labor.

14. INDEMNIFICATION

As each party is an agency defined in Chapter 768.28 Florida Statutes, each party agrees to be fully responsible for acts and omissions of its agents or employees to the extent permitted by law. Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity as applicable. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by either party as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of this MOU, or any part thereof. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this MOU.

The parties agree to maintain such insurance as is appropriate to its own organization. Each party agrees to conduct itself in accordance with the tenets of good faith in the execution of their responsibilities.

15. AGENCY OR EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

No provision of this MOU shall be construed as creating an agency or employment relationship between the parties. The parties agree that they are responsible for the actions of their representatives, employees, and instructors with regard to all aspects of this MOU.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

At all times during the term of this MOU, the Parties agree to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, rules, or procedures.

17. SIGNATURE IN COUNTERPARTS

This MOU may be executed in multiple identical counterparts, all of which shall constitute one agreement.

18. ACCEPTANCE OF FACSIMILE OR SCANNED SIGNATURES

This MOU shall be considered to be executed when the signature of a party is delivered by facsimile transmission or delivered by scanned image such as a pdf, or tiff file extension, as an attachment to electronic mail. Such facsimile or scanned signature shall be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature.

19. CONFIDENTIALITY OF RECORDS

In the event that either party to this MOU obtains access to any confidential records, files, or other information of the other party in connection with, or during the performance of this MOU, then that party shall keep all such records, files or other information confidential, and shall comply with all laws and regulations concerning the confidentiality of such records, files or other information to the same extent as such laws and regulations apply to the other party.

20. MERGER

This MOU constitutes and expresses the entire and integrated understanding and agreement between the parties hereto, superseding, incorporating and merging all prior understandings, agreements, and discussions relating to the transactions contemplated hereby, and no agreements, understandings, prior negotiations, prior discussions, warranties, representations or covenants not herein expressed shall be binding upon the parties. **IN WITNESS WHEREOF,** the parties hereto have made and executed this document on the respective dates under each signature:
