Required Performance

Enrollment of 120 out of school youth
90% of participants in an education or training program to achieve a measurable skills gain

90% of youth must attain a credential

Retention - 90% of youth exited because of military, post-secondary education or unsubsidized employment shall be retained in this activity through the second quarter after exit

90% of youth retained in military, post-secondary education or unsubsidized employment shall be retained in this activity in the fourth quarter after exit

Wage - Wage rate shall be minimum of \$9 an hour

Monitoring findings shall not exceed 5% of files reviewed
