THIS AMENDMENT TO SUBGRANT AGREEMENT NO. 2019-2020-CR-WIOA-OSY-2335, which was entered into the 25th day of June, 2019 by and between CAREERSOURCE BROWARD hereinafter referred to as CSBD, the administrative entity and fiscal agent for the CareerSource Broward Council of Elected Officials and the Broward Workforce Development Board, Inc., having its principal office at 2890 W. Cypress Creek Road, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309 and THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA hereinafter referred to as SUB-GRANTEE, existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Florida as a public body politic, having its principal office at 600 S.E. Third Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301, to begin on the date this Amendment is executed by the parties and to terminate June 30, 2022.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, CSBD and Sub-Grantee entered into an Agreement effective June 25, 2019 to serve out of school youth as defined under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 Pub. L. 113 – 128, which was amended extending the term of the Agreement to June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, CSBD wishes to amend the existing Agreement to extend the term of the Agreement through June 30, 2022, provide additional funds for the period of the extension and make the changes to the Article 7, Scope of Work as indicated herein in accordance; and

WHEREAS, the CSBD Governing Boards have approved this Amendment to Agreement no. 2019-2020-CR-WIOA-OSY-2335 at their meeting on May 27, 2021;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and obligations herein contained, and subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter stated, the parties hereto agree to amend Sub-Grantee Agreement No. 2019-2020-CR-WIOA-OSY-2335 as follows:

- **1.** Article 3, Fiscal Management, is amended by replacing the compensation in Section 3.2.1 a. with the underscored language as follows:
 - 3.2 Compensation
 - 3.2.1 Total Compensation
 - a. The total funds allocated for the program to be operated under this Agreement for the renewal period shall be <u>Five Hundred and Twelve</u> <u>Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty Four Dollars and zero cents (\$512,654.00)</u>, in accordance with the budget attached to this Amendment as Exhibit A.
- **2.** Article 5, Program Requirements, Section 5.16.1 is amended substitute the following for Article 5, Section 5.16.1 in the original Agreement as follows:
 - 5.16 Agreement Term
 - 5.16.1 The term of this Amendment to the Sub-grant Agreement shall begin on July 1, 2021 and is extended through June 30, 2022. The term of the Amended Sub-grant Agreement may be extended for an additional period beginning July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, after which, it may also be extended for an additional four one-year terms at the option of the CSBD governing boards. All extensions are subject to performance as defined herein and the appropriation and availability of funds as described in this Sub-grant Agreement.
- **3.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Sections 7.1, is amended to reduce the number of youth to be served to one hundred and thirty –five (135) youth and to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.1 Program Description Out-of-School Youth

Sub-grantee shall conduct an out-of-school youth program for a minimum of one hundred and thirty five (135) youth and a maximum of one hundred and ninety five (195) youth. This includes youth carried forward from the previous program year. Youth shall be at least 17 years old but have not yet reached

their 24th birthday at the time of enrollment into the WIOA program, have not completed high school or obtained a GED.

- **4.** Article 7, Scope of Work Section 7.2 Sub-section 7.2.1 is amended to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.2 Recruitment
 - 7.2.1 Sub-grantee shall recruit sufficient OSY youth, as defined herein, to be able to maintain a consistent caseload of 135 youth throughout the term of this Amendment. The number of youth to be enrolled includes the youth currently enrolled and carried forward from the previous contract term program year, to the new contract Agreement term. As youth exit successfully with their GED, the CSBD Program Manager, may approve additional enrollments to maintain a caseload of 135 youth. Subgrantee, shall make an effort to backfills slots within 45 days of a slot being vacated. Youth **may not** be enrolled nor may slots be backfilled in the 4th guarter of the program year as this is the renewal guarter when the CSBD governing boards determine whether to approve a renewal or approve providers following an RFP. and up to 60 additional youth recruited and enrolled by backfilling into slots vacated as youth complete the program, exit and enter unsubsidized employment, post-secondary school, the military or advanced training. In order to enroll youth in excess of 195 youth, Sub-grantee shall receive written approval from the Youth Program Manager.
- **5.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Section 7.2, Sub-section 7.2.3 is amended to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.2.3 Prior to enrolling youth into the program a copy of the youth's most recent GED Ready test must be provided to the CSBD Program Manager. along with a written recommendation from the Recruiter/Guidance Counselor or the youth's teacher that the youth is within 6 – 9 months of attainment of their GED. Sub-grantee shall backfill slots as youth successfully exit the program within 45 days of the slot being vacated except for during the 4th quarter. No youth shall be enrolled in Sub-grantee's program in the 4th guarter of the program year. A copy of the referral must be included in the youth's electronic CSBD DMS file simultaneous with the youth's eligibility determination and enrollment into an activity in EF. If a youth's assessment indicated that they are not within 6-9 months of being able to attain their GED, written approval for that youth's enrollment shall be obtained from the CSBD Youth Program Manager.

Youth recruited and enrolled into the program shall be within six (6) to nine (9) months of attaining their GED. Sub-Grantee shall backfill slots as youth successfully exit the program. Backfills shall occur within 45 days of a slot being vacated. Consider language that proof of the youth's progress i.e. GED Ready or written statement from the teacher must be provided.

- **6.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Section 7.2, sub-section 7.2.6 is amended to add new Subparagraphs "e" and "f" as follows:
 - 7.2.6 Sub-grantee shall recruit youth by employing the following strategies:
 - e. <u>Through recommendation of the Recruiter/Guidance Counselor,</u> who will have access to student records, and will be able to identify and contact youth and interview them to determine whether they who may be appropriate for the programs and to encourage their enrollment.
 - f. <u>Youth recruited shall be assessed prior to enrollment in the CSBD</u> program for suitability and a determination of whether the youth has the qualifications to be successful in the program.
- **7.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Section 7.2, Sub-section 7.2.9 is amended to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.2.9 If necessary To obtain progress information about youth in the program, Sub-grantee shall require youth to sign a FERPA release or other applicable release. Youth who refuse to sign the release shall not be enrolled.
- **8.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Section 7.2 is amended to add new Sub-sections 7.2.10 and 7.2.11 as follows:
 - 7.2.10 Youth shall not be enrolled without sufficient time left during the program year July 1 June 30 to attain either their GED or a measureable skills gain as defined by the USDOL.
 - 7.2.11 In general youth shall not be enrolled during the 4th quarter of the program year. The 4th quarter shall be used to recruit, interview and meet recruitment goals for the immediately upcoming program year.

- **9.** Article 7, Scope of Work, Section 7.3 Sub-section 7.3.1 is amended to add the underscored language:
 - 7.3.1 Sub-grantee shall be responsible for participant eligibility certification, which shall include an eligibility determination and assessment in accordance with WIOA. Prior to enrolling a youth into EmployFlorida the youth must be approved by the WIOA Program Manager via email documentation to Sub-grantee.
- **10.** Article 7, Section 7.3, Eligibility, Assessment and Individual Service Strategy, Subsection, 7.3.13 Sub-paragraph c, is amended to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.3.13
- c. All participants shall be basic skills assessed using the TABE, GED Ready or such other test approved by sub-grantee for purposes of determining basic skill levels. Sub-grantee may use basic skills assessments taken within the past 6 months rather than additional testing if available. The assessment shall be a critical tool in determining participant's suitability for the program. All participants shall be basic skills assessed using the TABE or such other test approved by Sub-grantee and the State of Florida Department of Economic Opportunity for purposes of determining basic skill levels.
- **11.** Article 7, Section 7.3 Eligibility, Assessment and Individual Service Strategy, Subsection 7.3.14, is amended to delete Sub-section 7.3.14 and Sub-sections 7.3.15 through 7.3.22 shall be renumbered 7.3.14 through 7.3.21 respectively, as follows:
 - 7.3.14 Sub-grantee shall administer the TABE test as a part of the eligibility certification process at the start of the program for purposes of determining the youth's basic skills levels and ability to succeed in the program. If Sub-grantee performed a TABE test upon enrollment of the youth into the GED program, they may use those scores or they may ask the youth to retake the TABE. These scores shall be noted in the participant's file and in Employ Florida.
- **12.** Article 7, Section 7.3 Eligibility, Assessment and Individual Service Strategy, Subsection, 7.3.16, (new 7.3.15) is amended to add the underscored language to paragraph 7.13.15 f:
 - f. TABE, or <u>other basic skills test or GED Ready Test to assess youth's</u> readiness to test.
- **13.** Article 7, Section 7.3 Eligibility, Assessment and Individual Service Strategy, Subsection, 7.3.17 (new 7.3.16) is amended to add the underscored language and to

delete the stricken language as follows:

- 7.13.16 Youth shall be recruited by the recruiter/guidance counselor, who shall contact, interview, assess and determine the suitability of the prospective youth program applicants and their qualifications for the program. Youth may also be assessed by a program teacher. Assessments must be conducted using appropriate assessment tools. Youth interested in and recruited for the program will be contacted by a program teacher and will receive a scheduled appointment for assessment and appropriate placement into this program. Assessments will be provided at the school/program site. Once the student is determined eligible for the program, enrollment into the program shall will-occur within two (2) weeks.
- **14.** Article 7, Section 7.4 Program Services to be Provided to the Youth, Sub-section 7.4.5 is amended to delete Sub-paragraph "a" and its sub sub-paragraphs and to renumber Sub-paragraphs "b" through "k," Sub-paragraphs "a" through "j" accordingly.
- **15.**Article 7, Section 7.4 Program Services to be Provided to the Youth, Sub-section 7.4.5, Sub-paragraph "b" (new Sub-paragraph "a") and Sub-sub-paragraphs "i" through "viii" are amended to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - a. Academic intervention and instruction in a classroom <u>or online</u> setting. Youth will be provided online instruction <u>utilizing varying</u> <u>modalities, including but not limited to the Essential Education</u> <u>Curriculum through the GEDREADY Curriculum program</u>. Teacher facilitators will meet with students individually to support student learning and achievement. Significant features of the curriculum include:
 - i. Scaffolding learning progression to meet rigorous standards.
 - ii. High-quality texts and instruction that promote comprehension and understanding of complex ideas.
 - iii. An early emphasis on speech, language, and literacy foundational skills <u>while in the classroom</u>.
 - iv. Instruction across all key literacy strands—language, reading, writing, speaking, and listening <u>while in the classroom</u>.
 - v. Integration of student-centric activity and peer-to-peer technologies.

- vi. Easy-to-implement instructional rotations and classroom routines.
- vii. Comprehensive benchmark and progress monitoring system, including the new Power Pass component, which mirrors highstakes assessments.
- viii. An online, leveled reading library, ReadingScape, with engaging, multimedia text selections.
- **16.** Article 7, Section 7.4, Program Services to be Provided to the Youth, Sub-section 7.4.7, Sub-paragraph "d" Sub Sub-paragraph "ii" is amended to add the underscored language and to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - ii. Sub-grantee shall develop a plan for expenditure of the funds on work experience and OJT activities within thirty days following the enrollment of each youth or in the case of youth already enrolled, within thirty (30) days of the execution of this contract. The work experience plan shall include:
- **17.** Article 7, Section 7.5, Participant Counseling and Case Management, Sub-section 7.5.1, is amended to add Sub-paragraphs a, b, and c, which language is underscored as follows:
 - 7.5.1 Sub-grantee staff will work to forge a bond with youth during the initial marketing/recruitment phase. Staff will present themselves as "caring adults," willing to deliver holistic services that support the entire family unit, whenever possible.
 - a. <u>Sub-grantee shall create a spread sheet identifying the youth</u> <u>assigned to each teacher facilitator.</u>
 - b. <u>The spread sheet shall be updated monthly to include the youth's</u> <u>name, state ID, WIOA Enrollment Date, training start date, Projected</u> <u>completion date, actual completion date, case closure date and</u> <u>closure reason.</u>
 - c. <u>The spreadsheet shall be made available to the CSBD Youth</u> <u>Program Manager electronically following each monthly update.</u>

18. Article 7, Section 7.6 Participant Incentives, Sub-section 7.6.3 is amended to delete SBBC 2019-2020-CR-WIOA-OSY-2335 Amendment 2 - PY 2021-2022 Page 8 the stricken language as follows:

- 7.6.3 In accordance with USDOL guidance youth may not be provided an incentive payment for enrollment or solely for attendance in class. Youth may not receive an incentive for participating in attending a work experience. The incentive should be for making it to the midway and/or completion of the work experience for which they are receiving a wage. Youth must show positive outcomes, passing assessments and attaining functional grade gains to be eligible for an incentive. Incentives should be interspersed throughout the youth's tenure in the program.
- **19.** Article 7, Participant Time, Data Entry, File Maintenance, Attendance, and Wages, Section 7.7.1, is amended to add the underscored language as follows:
 - 7.7.1 If work experience /internship payments are to be made to the youth, CSBD shall inform Sub-grantee of the payment date and amount. Subgrantee shall be responsible for keeping verified <u>time and attendance</u> documentation and for coordinating payroll distribution with CSBD. <u>Subgrantee shall maintain participant time and attendance records, which shall consist of daily time sheets indicating the hours per day and type of activity and shall be signed by the participant and the supervisor.</u>
- **20.** Article 7, , Participant Time, Data Entry, File Maintenance, Attendance, and Wages, Section 7.7.6, is amended to add the underscored language as follows:
 - 7.7.6 Youth's attendance and academic performance will be monitored by the FOCUS data system utilized in Adult Education (GED) classrooms. The teacher assigned will monitor student's progress on a weekly basis and will maintain each student's career pathway portfolio, monitoring both designated timeline and goals. <u>All youth enrolled in the program shall participate on a full time basis. You who plan to attend on a less than full time basis may only be enrolled in the program with the written approval of the CSBD Youth Program Manager,</u>
- **21.** Article 7, Section 7.8, Program Staffing, Sub-section 7.8.3 is amended to delete the stricken language as follows:
 - 7.8.3 All teacher facilitators funded under this Agreement shall be assigned a caseload. The caseload shall be evenly distributed among the facilitator teachers hired under this Agreement. With the addition of a job developer in the program budget Sub-Grantee shall assure the development of worksites is evenly distributed among the staff.
- **22.** Article 7, Section 7.8, Program Staffing, is amended to add a new Sub-section 7.8.8 and Sub-paragraphs "a" through "g" as follows:

- 7.8.8 <u>One of the staff to be hired shall be an individual with guidance counselor</u> <u>certification. The individual shall:</u>
 - a. <u>Familiarize themselves with the CSBD program funded by the</u> <u>Agreement and also with the scope of work for the Agreement</u> <u>between CSBD and Broward College.</u>
 - b. Learn WIOA OSY eligibility requirements as described herein.
 - c. <u>Review students records who have graduated or dropped out</u> <u>without graduating who are between the ages of 17 - 24</u>
 - d. <u>Contact candidates who fit the WIOA eligibility criteria and who may</u> <u>be suitable and have the qualifications to succeed in the program</u> <u>funded by this Agreement or the BC program.</u>
 - e. <u>Discuss the benefits of obtaining a GED or post-secondary training</u> with the youth contacted.
 - f. <u>Arrange an appointment for students declaring their interest in</u> <u>training so that the youth may be assessed by program staff and</u> <u>enrolled in either the program funded under this Agreement or the</u> <u>BC program.</u>
 - g. Recruitment goals shall be set and the 3rd quarter of the program year shall be used to recruit for quarter 1 of the following program year.
- **23.** Article 7, Section 7.8 Program Staffing, is amended to add a new Sub-section 7.8.9 as follows:
 - 7.8.9 <u>Sub-grantee shall provide a copy of the Agreement work statement to all</u> program staff and a copy of the Agreement fiscal requirements to all fiscal staff. Sub-grantee shall require all staff to sign a statement indicating that they have received the applicable sections of the Agreement and have reviewed and understand the Agreement objectives and requirements.
- **24.** Article 7, section 7.10, Performance, as amended by Amendment Number One is deleted in its entirety and is replaced by the following section 7.10 which is underscored as follows:
 - 7.10 <u>Performance</u>

- 7.10.1 <u>Sub-grantee shall meet the following performance with respect to the maintenance and correctness of their files:</u>
 - a. <u>Sub-grantee is responsible for implementing a self- monitoring protocol.</u>
 - b. Sub-grantee shall make all corrective actions, as a result of findings identified by (1) Sub-grantee through their own required self-monitoring, (2) the CSBD Program Manager or (3) the CSBD external monitors, including the state, within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the monitoring report. The corrective action must be accepted in writing by CSBD. Findings may not exceed five percent (5%) of the files monitored by CSBD, its external monitors or the state monitors, or of funds received, and no more than five percent (5%) of the Sub-grantee's data entry may be untimely or incorrect as determined by the CSBD Youth Program Manager.
- 7.10.2 Enrollment Goals Sub-grantee shall enroll 135 youth.
 - a. <u>A minimum of 94 youth or seventy percent (70%) of the 135 youth</u> <u>enrolled each program year, that this contract is in effect, must be able</u> <u>to complete their GED studies and obtain their high school credential by</u> <u>June 30 of that same year.</u>
 - b. For youth carried forward from the previous program year 100% must exit by June 30 of the subsequent program year.
 - c. <u>Of the 135 youth enrolled in Sub-grantee's GED program, 94 youth or</u> <u>70% of 135 youth must exit the program by June 30, of each year this</u> <u>program is in effect.</u>
- 7.10.3 <u>Sub-grantee shall be required to meet all the performance elements</u> <u>described below to be considered as having met performance:</u>
 - a. <u>121 youth which is 90% of the 135 youth enrolled each program year</u> this Agreement is in effect must achieve a measurable skill gain during the program year each year that they remain in the program. <u>Measureable skills gain is defined by USDOL and the State of Florida.</u> <u>This shall consist of attainment of the GED and/or passing a "GED READY" component.</u>
 - b. Of the 135 youth program participants enrolled in Sub-grantee's GED program, 94 youth or 70% of 135 youth must exit the program by June 30, of each year this program is effect.

- c. Of the 94 youth that must exit prior to June 30 each year 80 youth, which is 85%, must complete their GED and obtain a High School credential by June 30, 2022. To the extent youth in excess of 94 youth exit by the end of the program year 85% of the total exiting must complete their GED and obtain a High School credential.
- d. Of the 94 youth that must exit prior to June 30 each year 80 youth or 85% of the 94 youth shall enter the military, post-secondary education or be in unsubsidized employment at the time of their exit from the WIOA program and through the second (2nd) quarter after exit from the program so as to be considered as having met the "employment measure."
- e. Youth placed into employment shall earn a minimum of \$9.00 an hour.
- f. Of the 80 youth that must be placed into employment, the military or post-secondary training 72 of the youth, which is 90% of the 80 youth, shall be retained in post-secondary education, employment or the military through the fourth (4th) guarter after their exit from the program.
- **25.** All provisions of said Agreement, which are not in conflict with this Amendment, shall continue to be enforced in accordance with the terms and conditions therein.
- **26.** Except as expressly stated in this Amendment, all other definitions, terms and conditions, provisions, paragraphs and exhibits of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and without change.
- **27.** This Amendment and all its Exhibits/Attachments are made a part of said Agreement.
- **28.** The effective date of this Amendment shall be the date on which it has been signed by all the Parties.
