Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region Not Seasonally Adjusted March 17, 2025

• The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade County) was 2.4 percent in January 2025. This rate was 0.5 percentage point greater than the region's year ago rate of 1.9 percent. The region's January 2025 unemployment rate was 1.3 percentage points lower than the state rate of 3.7 percent. The labor force was 1,441,653, down 2,527 (-0.2 percent) over the year. There were 33,915 unemployed residents in the region.

Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metro Division

- In January 2025, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,347,100, an increase of 26,200 jobs (+2.0 percent) over the year.
- The Mining, Logging, and Construction (+6.3 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2.3 percent); Leisure and Hospitality (+2.2 percent); Manufacturing (+1.9 percent); Financial Activities (+0.9 percent); and Professional and Business Services (+0.2 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+7,400 jobs) and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,600 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was tied for the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Education and Health Services (+7,100 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Mining, Logging, and Construction (+6.3 percent) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+3,300 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was tied for the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+900 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2.3 percent) industry.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+7,400 jobs); Education and Health Services (+7,100 jobs); Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,600 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+3,300 jobs); Government (+1,900 jobs); Other Services (+1,000 jobs); Manufacturing (+900 jobs); Financial Activities (+900 jobs); and Professional and Business Services (+400 jobs).
