Overview of the CareerSource Broward Region Not Seasonally Adjusted November 18, 2022

• The unemployment rate in the CareerSource Broward region (Broward County) was 2.6 percent in October 2022. This rate was 1.3 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 3.9 percent. The region's October 2022 unemployment rate was 0.1 percentage point lower than the state rate of 2.7 percent. The labor force was 1,085,572, up 37,779 (+3.6 percent) over the year. There were 28,390 unemployed residents in the region.

Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach Metro Division

- In October 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach MD was 900,800, an increase of 36,300 jobs (+4.2 percent) over the year.
- The Leisure and Hospitality (+9.8 percent); Construction (+4.9 percent); and Professional and Business Services (+4.5 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Construction (+2,400 jobs) industry.
- The Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Construction (+4.9 percent) industry.
- The Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach MD had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Financial Activities (+2,500 jobs) and Information (+400 jobs) industries.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Leisure and Hospitality (+8,600 jobs);
 Professional and Business Services (+7,300 jobs);
 Education and Health Services (+6,100 jobs);
 Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+5,300 jobs);
 Financial Activities (+2,500 jobs);
 Construction (+2,400 jobs);
 Other Services (+2,100 jobs);
 Manufacturing (+1,000 jobs);
 Government (+600 jobs);
