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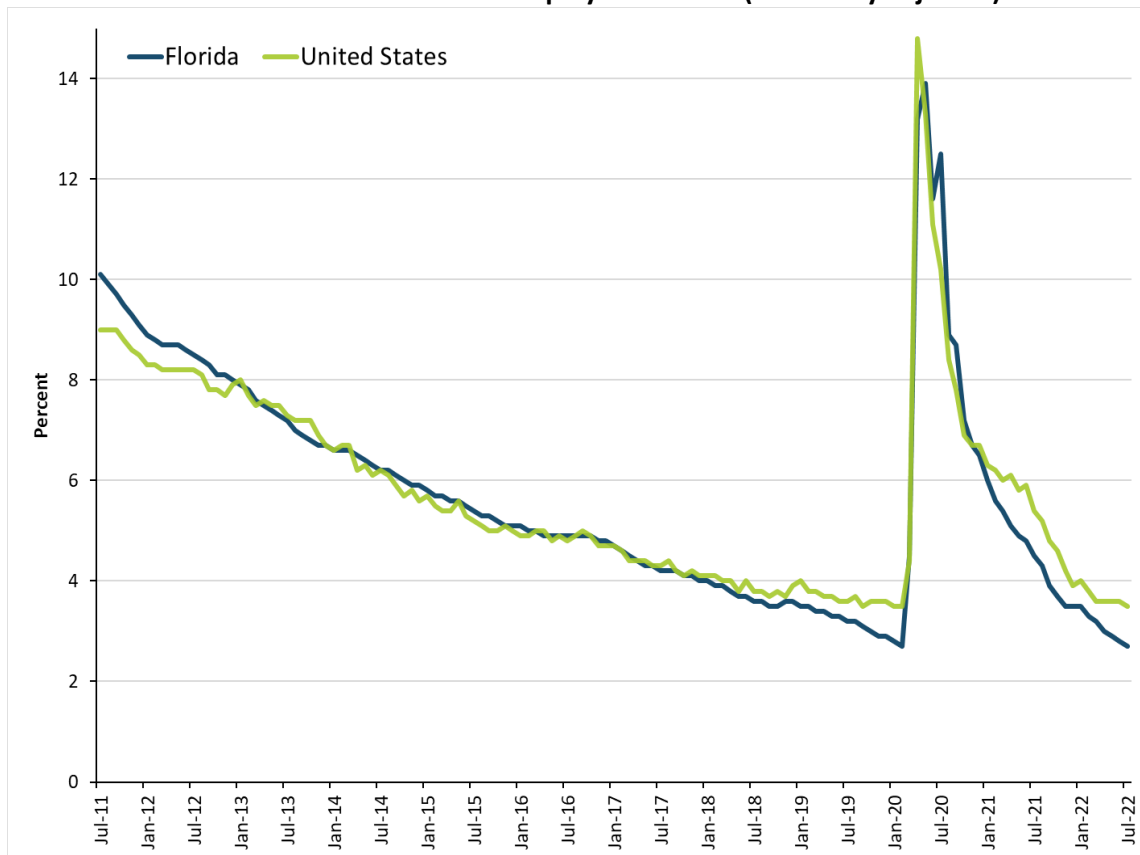
Florida's July Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 2.7 percent in July 2022, down 0.1 percentage point from the June 2022 rate, and down 1.8 percentage points from a year ago. There were 283,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,658,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in July.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,433,400 in July 2022, an increase of 73,800 jobs (+0.8 percent) over the month. The state gained 437,800 jobs over the year, an increase of 4.9 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.2 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,640,400 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in July.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+102,500 jobs, +8.9 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+95,900 jobs, +5.2 percent); professional and business services (+90,100 jobs, +6.1 percent); education and health services (+39,700 jobs, +2.9 percent); financial activities (+27,600 jobs, +4.4 percent); other services (+25,400 jobs, +7.6 percent); manufacturing (+22,800 jobs, +5.9 percent); construction (+18,900 jobs, +3.3 percent); information (+11,400 jobs, +8.1 percent); and total government (+4,300 jobs, +0.4 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In July 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.7 percent), followed by St. Johns County (2.2 percent), and Miami-Dade County and Okaloosa County (2.3 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (5.9 percent) in Florida in July 2022, followed by Highlands County (4.4 percent), and Citrus County, Hardee County and Putnam County (4.2 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In July 2022, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+80,000 jobs, +6.8 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+66,600 jobs, +5.2 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+64,900 jobs, +4.7 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
