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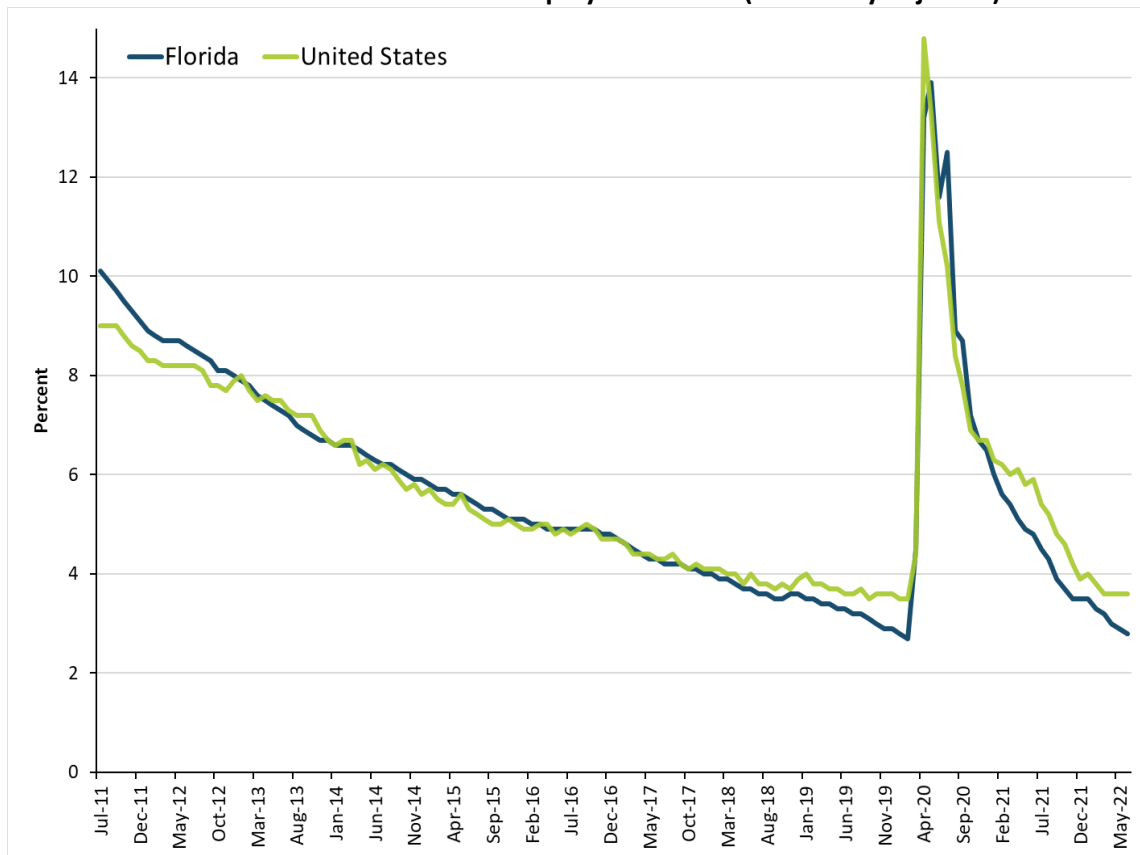
### Florida's June Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 2.8 percent in June 2022, down 0.1 percentage point from the revised May 2022 rate, and down 2.0 percentage points from a year ago. There were 303,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,633,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in June.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,344,500 in June 2022, an increase of 30,600 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. The state gained 453,600 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.1 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.3 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021.

## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,551,500 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in June.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+109,900 jobs, +9.8 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+104,400 jobs, +5.7 percent); professional and business services (+93,100 jobs, +6.4 percent); financial activities (+35,100 jobs, +5.7 percent); education and health services (+29,800 jobs, +2.2 percent); manufacturing (+27,900 jobs, +7.2 percent); other services (+27,500 jobs, +8.3 percent); construction (+14,600 jobs, +2.5 percent); information (+9,700 jobs, +7.0 percent); and total government (+1,500 jobs, +0.1 percent).

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.9 percent), followed by Miami-Dade County (2.2 percent), and St. Johns County (2.3 percent).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (5.3 percent) in Florida in June 2022, followed by Highlands County (4.6 percent), and Citrus County and Putnam County (4.4 percent each).

## Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2022, 23 out of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+84,600 jobs, +7.3 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+83,100 jobs, +6.6 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+66,700 jobs, +4.8 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring (-400 jobs, -1.6 percent)

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
