

Florida's May Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.3 percent in May 2024, unchanged from the April 2024 rate, and up 0.5 percentage point from a year ago. There were 361,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,081,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.0 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,951,600 in May 2024, an increase of 6,000 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 222,200 jobs over the year, an increase of 2.3 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.8 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Seven of ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in May.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included trade, transportation, and utilities (+55,700 jobs, +2.8 percent); education and health services (+51,900 jobs, +3.5 percent); leisure and hospitality (+38,600 jobs, +3.0 percent); total government (+29,600 jobs, +2.6 percent); construction (+27,700 jobs, +4.4 percent); other services (+13,800 jobs, +3.8 percent); and manufacturing (+6,900 jobs, +1.6 percent).
- The industries losing jobs over the year were financial activities (-1,700 jobs, -0.2 percent) and information (-1,000 jobs, -0.6 percent).
- The professional and business services industry was unchanged in jobs over the year.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2024, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.9 percent), followed by Miami-Dade County (2.2 percent), and Okaloosa County and Wakulla County (2.6 percent each).
- Citrus County had the highest unemployment rate (4.5 percent) in Florida in May 2024, followed by Highlands County and Sumter County (4.2 percent each), and Hardee County and Hendry County (4.1 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2024, 23 of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+33,800 jobs, +2.6 percent), followed by the Tampa-Saint Petersburg-Clearwater MSA (+23,900 jobs, +1.6 percent), and the Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach MD (+21,100 jobs, +2.3 percent).
- Only the Homosassa Springs MSA was unchanged in jobs over the year.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
