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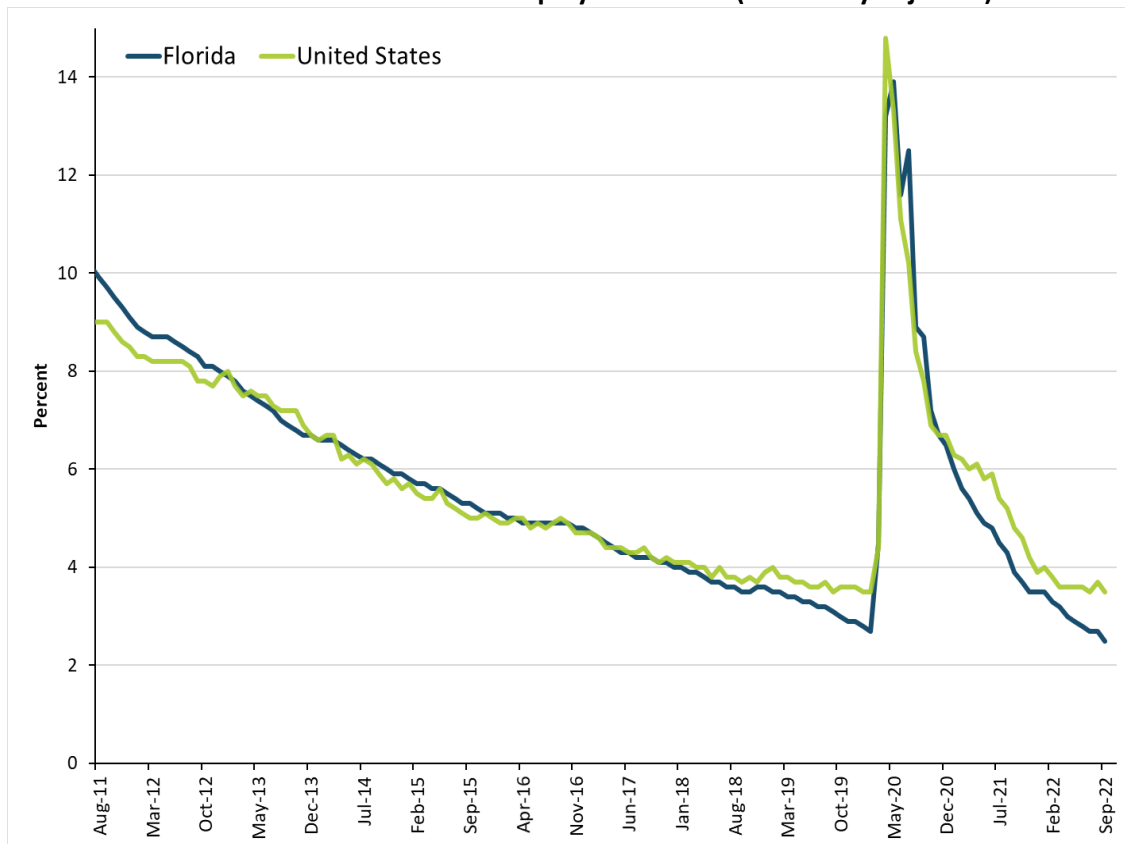
### Florida's September Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 2.5 percent in September 2022, down 0.2 percentage point from the August 2022 rate, and down 1.4 percentage points from a year ago. There were 266,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,714,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in September.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,501,800 in September 2022, an increase of 48,800 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month. The state gained 463,300 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.1 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 3.9 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021.

### Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,708,800 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in September.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+106,800 jobs, +9.1 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+94,000 jobs, +5.1 percent); education and health services (+71,100 jobs, +5.3 percent); professional and business services (+66,300 jobs, +4.5 percent); financial activities (+35,600 jobs, +5.7 percent); other services (+30,900 jobs, +9.2 percent); manufacturing (+28,500 jobs, +7.3 percent); construction (+24,400 jobs, +4.2 percent); information (+8,000 jobs, +5.6 percent); and total government (+1,800 jobs, +0.2 percent).

#### **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In September 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.6 percent), followed by Miami-Dade County (2.0 percent), St. Johns County (2.1 percent), and Okaloosa County and Wakulla County (2.2 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (4.8 percent) in Florida in September 2022, followed by Highlands County (4.1 percent), Citrus County (4.0 percent), and Sumter County (3.9 percent).

#### **Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In September 2022, 23 of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+80,800 jobs, +6.8 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+67,100 jobs, +4.8 percent), and Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+65,800 jobs, +5.0 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring MSA (-500 jobs, -2.0 percent).

Note: Hurricane Ian had no discernible effect on the employment and unemployment data for September. Household survey data collection was completed before the storm made landfall in Florida, and establishment survey data collection rates were within normal ranges. In the establishment survey, employees who are paid for any part of the pay period, even 1 hour, that includes the 12<sup>th</sup> of the month are counted as employed. In the household survey, persons with a job are counted as employed even if they miss work for the entire survey reference week (the week including the 12<sup>th</sup> of the month), regardless of whether or not they are paid.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
