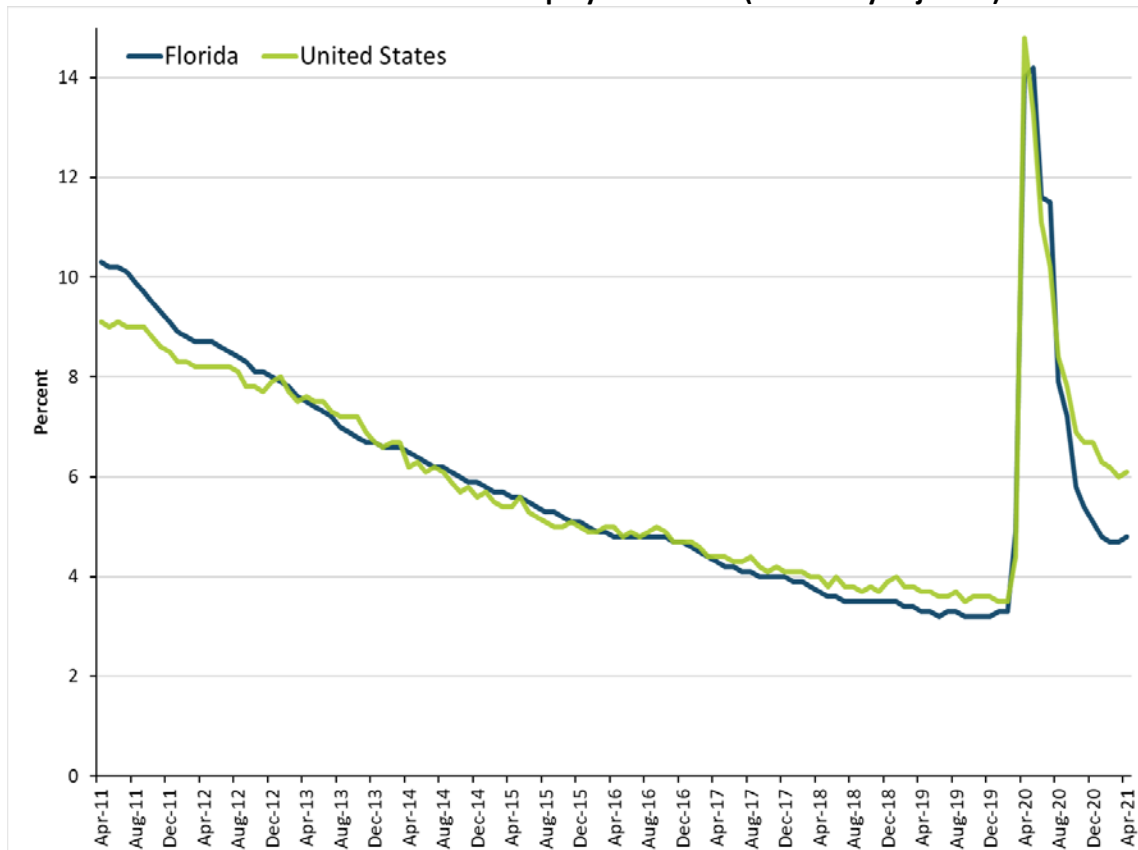
### Florida's April Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8 percent in April 2021, up 0.1 percentage point from the March 2021 rate, and down 9.2 percentage points from a year ago. There were 487,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,243,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 6.1 percent in April.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,568,900 in April 2021, an increase of 16,900 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 766,000 jobs over the year, an increase of 9.8 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 10.9 percent over the year.

The April 2021 labor force statistics and the total nonagricultural employment have not reached the pre-pandemic levels in February 2020.

## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+766,000 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,568,900 in April 2021, up 766,000 jobs compared to a year ago. Nine of the ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in April.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+302,000 jobs, +42.7 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+150,200 jobs, +9.4 percent); professional and business services (+111,300 jobs, +8.7 percent); education and health services (+99,500 jobs, +8.1 percent); other services (+55,900 jobs, +20.4 percent); construction (+29,400 jobs, +5.5 percent); financial activities (+24,300 jobs, +4.2 percent); manufacturing (+19,500 jobs, +5.4 percent); and information (+3,100 jobs, +2.5 percent).
- One major industry losing jobs was total government (-29,800 jobs, -2.7 percent).

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2021, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.2 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.4 percent), Wakulla County (3.5 percent), and Okaloosa County (3.7 percent).
- Miami-Dade County and Hamilton County had the highest unemployment rate (6.9 percent each) in Florida in April 2021, followed by Osceola County (6.7 percent), and Putnam County (6.5 percent).

## Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2021, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa - St. Petersburg - Clearwater (+139,100 jobs, +11.2 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+103,400 jobs, +10.0 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+78,000 jobs, +10.6 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
