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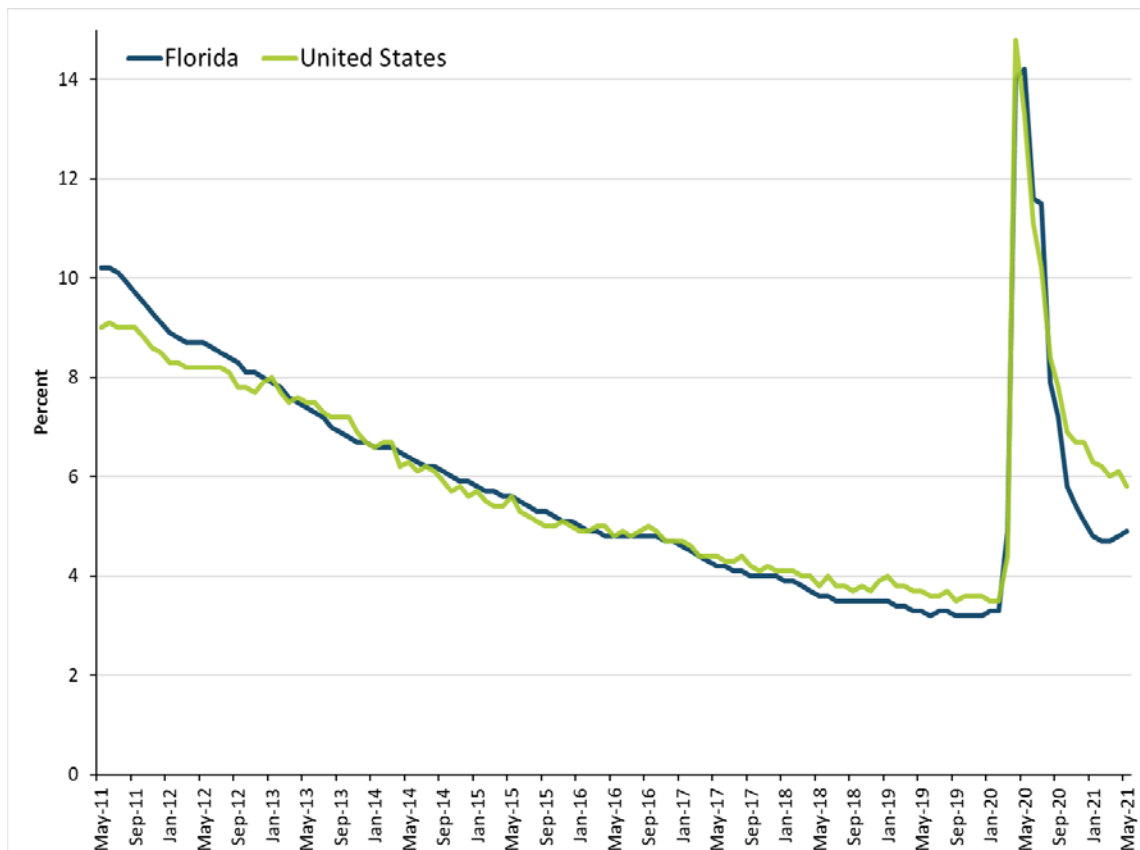
### Florida's May Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9 percent in May 2021, up 0.1 percentage point from the April 2021 rate, and down 9.3 percentage points from a year ago. There were 503,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,314,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,617,700 in May 2021, an increase of 39,900 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month. The state gained 566,800 jobs over the year, an increase of 7.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 8.9 percent over the year.

The May 2021 labor force statistics and the total nonagricultural employment have not reached the pre-pandemic levels in February 2020.

## **Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)**

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+814,800 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,617,700 in May 2021, up 566,800 jobs compared to a year ago. Nine of the ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in May.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+234,800 jobs, +30.0 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+114,600 jobs, +6.9 percent); professional and business services (+94,600 jobs, +7.3 percent); education and health services (+58,400 jobs, +4.6 percent); other services (+36,600 jobs, +12.4 percent); financial activities (+23,700 jobs, +4.1 percent); construction (+16,500 jobs, +3.0 percent); manufacturing (+11,100 jobs, +3.0 percent); and information (+5,200 jobs, +4.1 percent).
- One major industry losing jobs was total government (-28,200 jobs, -2.5 percent).

## **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In May 2021, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.1 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.2 percent), Wakulla County (3.5 percent), and Santa Rosa County and Okaloosa County (3.6 percent each).
- Miami-Dade County had the highest unemployment rate (6.7 percent) in Florida in May 2021, followed by Hamilton County and Osceola County (6.6 percent each), and Putnam County (6.5 percent).

## **Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In May 2021, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+109,700 jobs, +10.1 percent), Tampa - St. Petersburg - Clearwater (+97,600 jobs, +7.6 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+82,100 jobs, +7.7 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+62,100 jobs, +8.2 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
