

**Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region  
Not Seasonally Adjusted  
June 18, 2021**

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 6.6 percent in May 2021. This rate was 4.0 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 10.6 percent. The labor force was 1,370,448, up 135,990 (+11.0) over the year. There were 90,189 unemployed residents in the region.
- Monroe County had the lowest unemployment rate (3.1 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Miami-Dade County (6.7 percent).
- In May 2021 nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division was 1,143,500, an increase of 82,100 jobs (+7.7 percent) over the year.
- The leisure and hospitality (+43.7 percent); other services (+16.6 percent); professional and business services (+11.5 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+7.0 percent); and financial activities (+4.6 percent) industries grew as fast or faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in trade, transportation, and utilities (+18,300 jobs).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in leisure and hospitality (+34,400 jobs); professional and business services (+19,100 jobs); other services (+6,700 jobs); and financial activities (+3,600 jobs).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in leisure and hospitality (+43.7 percent).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division was tied for the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in manufacturing (+900 jobs).
- The industries gaining in jobs over the year were leisure and hospitality (+34,400 jobs); professional and business services (+19,100 jobs); trade, transportation, and utilities (+18,300 jobs); other services (+6,700 jobs); education and health services (+4,600 jobs); financial activities (+3,600 jobs); manufacturing (+900 jobs); and information (+300 jobs).
- The government (-4,700 jobs) and mining, logging, and construction (-1,100 jobs) industries lost jobs over the year.
