

**Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region  
Not Seasonally Adjusted  
January 20, 2023**

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 1.4 percent in December 2022. This rate was 1.5 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 2.9 percent. The region's December 2022 unemployment rate was 0.8 percentage point lower than the state rate of 2.2 percent. The labor force was 1,396,142, up 27,646 (+2.0 percent) over the year. There were 20,171 unemployed residents in the region.
- Miami-Dade County and Monroe County had the same unemployment rate (1.4 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region.

**Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metro Division**

- In December 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,292,900, an increase of 61,000 jobs (+5.0 percent) over the year.
- The Manufacturing (+10.2 percent); Leisure and Hospitality (+8.7 percent); Education and Health Services (+8.0 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+6.2 percent); and Financial Activities (+4.9 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+19,300 jobs); Education and Health Services (+15,600 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,300 jobs); and Financial Activities (+4,200 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+10.2 percent) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+6.2 percent) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+11,800 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Financial Activities (+4.9 percent) industry.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+19,300 jobs); Education and Health Services (+15,600 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+11,800 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+4,600 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,300 jobs); Financial

Activities (+4,200 jobs); Other Services (+3,100 jobs); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+200 jobs).

- The industries losing jobs over the year were Government (-1,900 jobs) and Information (-200 jobs).
