

**Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region  
Not Seasonally Adjusted  
August 19, 2022**

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 2.3 percent in July 2022. This rate was 2.9 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 5.2 percent. The region's July 2022 unemployment rate was 0.5 percentage point lower than the state rate of 2.8 percent. The labor force was 1,368,957, down 2,304 (-0.2 percent) over the year. There were 30,837 unemployed residents in the region.
- Monroe County had the lowest unemployment rate (1.7 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Miami-Dade County (2.3 percent).

**Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metro Division**

- In July 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,253,200, an increase of 80,000 jobs (+6.8 percent) over the year.
- The Leisure and Hospitality (+12.3 percent); Manufacturing (+11.9 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.3 percent); Professional and Business Services (+7.1 percent); Education and Health Services (+6.4 percent); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+6.3 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+24,500 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,200 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,800 jobs); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,300 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+11.9 percent) and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.3 percent) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Professional and Business Services (+13,100 jobs) and Financial Activities (+3,700 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+15,500 jobs) and Other Services (+3,600 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+12.3 percent) and Education and Health Services (+6.4 percent) industries.

- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+24,500 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+15,500 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+13,100 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,200 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,800 jobs); Financial Activities (+3,700 jobs); Other Services (+3,600 jobs); Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,300 jobs); and Information (+300 jobs).
- The Government (-1,000 jobs) industry lost jobs over the year.
