Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region Not Seasonally Adjusted November 18, 2022

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 1.7 percent in October 2022. This rate was 2.1 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 3.8 percent. The region's October 2022 unemployment rate was 1.0 percentage point lower than the state rate of 2.7 percent. The labor force was 1,382,800, up 16,691 (+1.2 percent) over the year. There were 23,627 unemployed residents in the region.
- Miami-Dade County and Monroe County had the same unemployment rate (1.7 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region.

Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metro Division

- In October 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,281,800, an increase of 75,000 jobs (+6.2 percent) over the year.
- The Leisure and Hospitality (+11.7 percent); Manufacturing (+10.9 percent); Other Services (+8.9 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.0 percent); Financial Activities (+6.6 percent); and Professional and Business Services (+5.5 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+24,000 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.0 percent) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Education and Health Services (+10,800 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+10,400 jobs); Financial Activities (+5,700 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,500 jobs); and Other Services (+4,200 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+11.7 percent); Manufacturing (+10.9 percent); and Financial Activities (+6.6 percent) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Leisure and Hospitality (+15,300 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Other Services (+8.9 percent) industry.

- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+24,000 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+15,300 jobs); Education and Health Services (+10,800 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+10,400 jobs); Financial Activities (+5,700 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,500 jobs); Other Services (+4,200 jobs); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+600 jobs).
- The Government (-500 jobs) industry lost jobs over the year.
- The Information industry was unchanged in jobs over the year.
