## Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region Not Seasonally Adjusted November 17, 2023

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 1.6 percent in October 2023. This rate was 0.7 percentage point lower than the region's year ago rate of 2.3 percent. The region's October 2023 unemployment rate was 1.4 percentage points lower than the state rate of 3.0 percent. The labor force was 1,424,922, down 10,642 (-0.7 percent) over the year. There were 22,367 unemployed residents in the region.
- Miami-Dade County had the lowest unemployment rate (1.6 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Monroe County (2.0 percent).

## Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metro Division

- In October 2023, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,319,300, an increase of 44,300 jobs (+3.5 percent) over the year.
- The Manufacturing (+7.4 percent); Other Services (+6.3 percent); Professional and Business Services (+5.7 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4.8 percent); and Government (+4.0 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+15,200 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+11,900 jobs); Government (+5,700 jobs); Manufacturing (+3,200 jobs); and Other Services (+3,000 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+7.4 percent) and Other Services (+6.3 percent) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Professional and Business Services (+5.7 percent) and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4.8 percent) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Education and Health Services (+8,500 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was tied for the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Financial Activities (+1,100 jobs) industry.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+15,200 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+11,900 jobs); Education and Health Services

(+8,500 jobs); Government (+5,700 jobs); Manufacturing (+3,200 jobs); Other Services (+3,000 jobs); and Financial Activities (+1,100 jobs).

• The industries losing jobs over the year were Mining, Logging, and Construction (-2,100 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (-1,200 jobs); and Information (-1,000 jobs).
