Chef and Head Cook

Prepare, season, and cook soups, meats, vegetables, desserts, or other foodstuffs in restaurants.



Bartender

Prepare and serve drinks for patrons of the establishment.



Waiter or Waitress

Take orders and serve food and beverages to patrons at tables in dining establishment.



Maid & Housekeeping Cleaner

Perform any combination of light cleaning duties to maintain private households or commercial establishments.



Baggage Porter & Bell Hop

Handle baggage for travelers at transportation terminals or for guests at hotels or similar establishments.



Food Service Manager

Supervise workers engaged in preparing and serving food.

Travel Agent

Plan and sell transportation and accommodations for travel agency customers.



Hotel, Motel & Resort Desk Clerk

Accommodate hotel, motel, and resort patrons by registering and assigning rooms to guests, issuing room keys, transmitting and receiving messages and keeping records of occupied rooms.



Lodging Manager

Ensure that lodging establishments are run efficiently and profitably; provide guests with hotel conveniences.
