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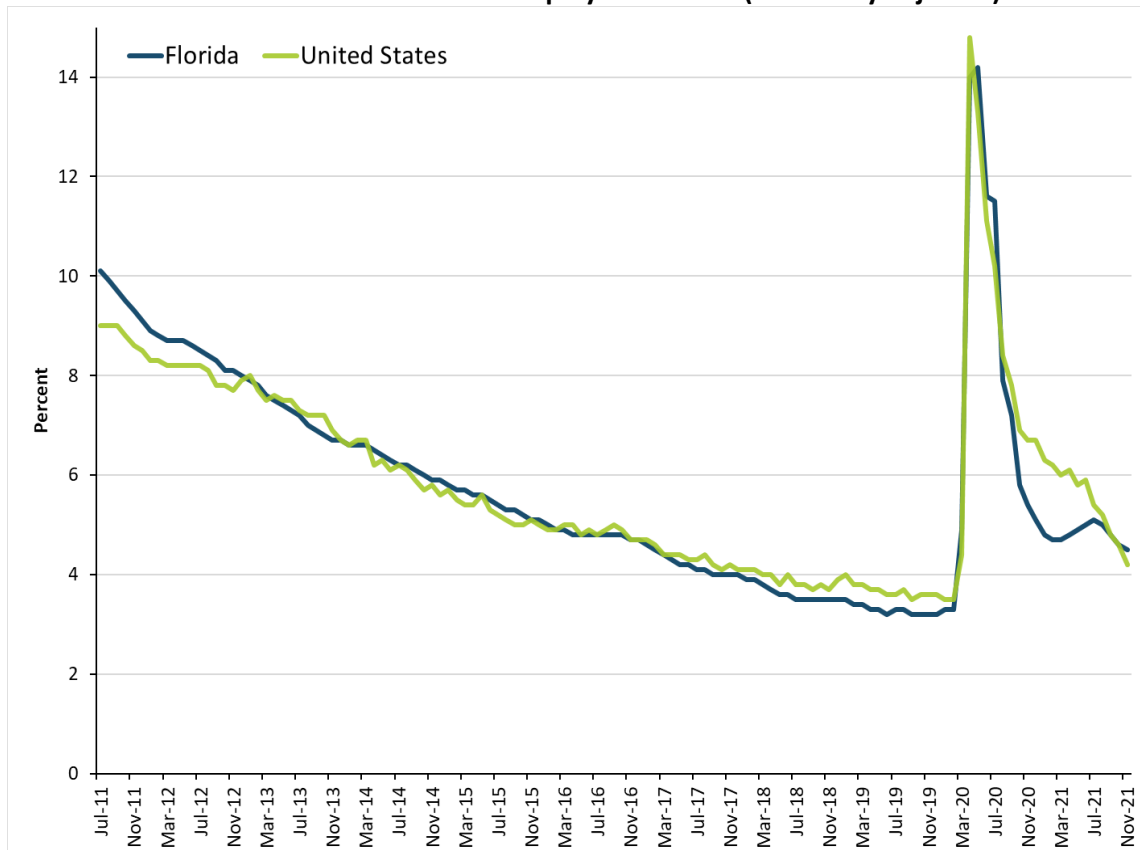
### Florida's November Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.5 percent in November 2021, down 0.1 percentage point from the October 2021 rate, and down 0.9 percentage point from a year ago. There were 483,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,632,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in November.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,960,200 in November 2021, an increase of 51,100 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the month. The state gained 485,600 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.7 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.1 percent over the year.

The November 2021 total nonagricultural employment has not reached the pre-pandemic levels in February 2020.

### **Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)**

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back 91.2 percent of the jobs lost (+1,157,300 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,960,200 in November 2021, up 485,600 jobs compared to a year ago. All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in November.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+134,800 jobs, +13.5 percent); professional and business services (+90,700 jobs, +6.7 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+85,800 jobs, +4.9 percent); education and health services (+52,100 jobs, +4.0 percent); financial activities (+31,600 jobs, +5.3 percent); construction (+27,300 jobs, +4.9 percent); other services (+26,900 jobs, +8.4 percent); total government (+15,600 jobs, +1.4 percent); information (+10,800 jobs, +8.5 percent); and manufacturing (+9,800 jobs, +2.6 percent).

### **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In November 2021, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.2 percent), followed by St. Johns County (2.6 percent), Collier County, Nassau County, Okaloosa County and Wakulla County (2.9 percent each), and Clay County and Santa Rosa County (3.0 percent each).
- Putnam County had the highest unemployment rate (5.4 percent) in Florida in November 2021, followed by Hamilton County and Hendry County (5.1 percent each), and Sumter County (5.0 percent).

### **Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In November 2021, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+91,500 jobs, +7.7 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+72,000 jobs, +5.3 percent), and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+70,100 jobs, +6.2 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
