Overview of the CareerSource South Florida Region Not Seasonally Adjusted November 19, 2021

- The unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 3.8 percent in October 2021. This rate was 4.5 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 8.3 percent. The region's October 2021 unemployment rate was 0.2 percentage point lower than the state rate of 4.0 percent. The labor force was 1,390,233, up 40,325 (+3.0 percent) over the year. There were 52,154 unemployed residents in the region.
- Monroe County had the lowest unemployment rate (2.5 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Miami-Dade County (3.8 percent).
- In October 2021 nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division was 1,182,200, an increase of 69,300 jobs (+6.2 percent) over the year.
- The leisure and hospitality (+22.3 percent); professional and business services (+12.3 percent); financial activities (+6.9 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+5.2 percent); and government (+0.4 percent) industries grew as fast or faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in leisure and hospitality (+22.3 percent).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in trade, transportation, and utilities (+14,400 jobs) and financial activities (+5,500 jobs).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in financial activities (+6.9 percent).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in professional and business services (+21,500 jobs) and government (+600 jobs).
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the third fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in trade, transportation, and utilities (+5.2 percent).

- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division had the third highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in leisure and hospitality (+21,800 jobs) and other services (+4,000 jobs).
- The industries gaining in jobs over the year were leisure and hospitality (+21,800 jobs); professional and business services (+21,500 jobs); trade, transportation, and utilities (+14,400 jobs); financial activities (+5,500 jobs); other services (+4,000 jobs); education and health services (+1,400 jobs); government (+600 jobs); manufacturing (+500 jobs); and information (+300 jobs).
- The mining, logging, and construction (-700 jobs) industry lost jobs over the year.
