


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Florida's August Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in August 2021, down 0.1 percentage point from the July 2021 rate, and down 2.9 percentage points from a year ago. There were 529,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,543,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 5.2 percent in August.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,777,200 in August 2021, an increase of 15,500 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 377,700 jobs over the year, an increase of 4.5 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.3 percent over the year.

The August 2021 total nonagricultural employment has not reached the pre-pandemic levels in February 2020.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+974,300 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,777,200 in August 2021, up 377,700 jobs compared to a year ago. Nine of the ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in August.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+137,700 jobs, +14.6 percent); professional and business services (+58,300 jobs, +4.3 percent); education and health services (+46,500 jobs, +3.6 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+44,300 jobs, +2.5 percent); other services (+32,900 jobs, +10.5 percent); financial activities (+30,700 jobs, +5.2 percent); construction (+11,700 jobs, +2.1 percent); information (+10,200 jobs, +8.1 percent); and manufacturing (+9,600 jobs, +2.6 percent).
- One major industry losing jobs was total government (-2,600 jobs, -0.2 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2021, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.0 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.4 percent), Okaloosa County (3.7 percent), and Nassau County and Wakulla County (3.8 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (7.4 percent) in Florida in August 2021, followed by Miami-Dade County (6.7 percent), Highlands County and Putnam County (6.5 percent each), and Sumter County (6.4 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

In August 2021, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+74,000 jobs, +6.4 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+68,000 jobs, +6.2 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+67,600 jobs, +5.1 percent), and West Palm Beach-Boca Raton-Delray Beach (+36,100 jobs, +6.1 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
